Bill Summary: The bill expresses the City Council's support for protected bicycle lanes downtown on portions of Beaver Street, Monroe Street, Hogan Street, and Liberty Street.

Background Information: The City of Jacksonville, Florida, Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan from September 2017 states that "Jacksonville needs a roadmap to quickly and effectively close the gap between the potential for bicycling and walking in the area and the reality of a dangerous, inconvenient, and unattractive environment for bicycling and walking today." One method of improving and promoting bicycle travel is to add protected bicycle lanes; this resolution expresses support for the design and installation of new protected lanes on portions of Beaver Street, Monroe Street, Hogan Street, and Liberty Street. The City of Jacksonville Public Works Department, the Downtown Investment Authority, and Bike Walk Jax, Jacksonville's bicycle and pedestrian advocacy organization, have all expressed support for the installation of protected bicycle lanes.
