5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$391,472.29 PAID TO
6 THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BY THE BOEING COMPANY
7 FOR THE PROVISION OF ADDITIONAL AIRCRAFT RESCUE
8 FIREFIGHTING (ARFF) SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE
9 JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT FOR
10 AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS AT CECIL AIRPORT, AS
11 INITIATED BY B.T. 23-030; AUTHORIZING POSITIONS,
12 AS INITIATED BY R.C. 23-049; APPROVING AND
13 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE
14 CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER,
15 FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE BOEING
16 INDIRECT SUPPLY CHAIN FIXED PRICE CONTRACT FORM
17 BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE BOEING
18 COMPANY PROVIDING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR
19 PROVISION OF ARFF SERVICES AT CECIL AIRPORT;
20 PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE
21 AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE
22 EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE
23 DATE.
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25 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

26 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2022-2023 fiscal year,
27 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated
28 sum from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
29 listed in subsection (b):

5 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

6 The funding above is an appropriation of \$391,472.29 paid
7 by The Boeing Company ("Boeing") to the City of
8 Jacksonville for the provision of additional Aircraft
9 Rescue Firefighting (ARFF) services provided by the
10 Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) for aircraft
11 operations at Cecil Airport.

12 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
13 Section 1 is to receive revenue from The Boeing Company for the
14 provision of additional ARFF services and support at Cecil Airport.
15 JFRD has provided ARFF services to Boeing since the early 2000's.
16 Boeing recently notified JFRD of its intent to provide Cat 6 aircraft
17 operations at Cecil Airport and requested additional ARFF services
18 to support these operations which will be necessary due to the size
19 of aircraft that will frequently be flying into and out of the
20 facility. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) will require
21 greater levels of fire protection at Cecil Airport to accommodate
22 these types of planes. The Boeing Indirect Supply Chain Fixed Price
23 Contract Form (the "Agreement") authorized herein provides for JFRD
24 to make available three additional ARFF-trained JFRD personnel per
25 day to meet FAA requirements. JFRD currently has the necessary
26 equipment to provide these additional services but will require
27 authorization for nine additional full-time equivalent (FTE)
28 positions to maintain this service level.

29 **Section 3. Approval of Positions.** There are hereby
30 approved the positions more fully described in R.C. 23-049, attached
31 hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.

1 **Section 4. Approval and Authorization to Execute.** There is
2 hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation
3 Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver for and on
4 behalf of the City, the Boeing Indirect Supply Chain Fixed Price
5 Contract Form (the "Agreement"), in substantially the same form placed
6 **On File** with the Legislative Services Division and incorporated herein
7 by this reference, between the City of Jacksonville and The Boeing
8 Company providing the terms and conditions relative to the provision
9 of ARFF services at Cecil Airport. The Agreement may include such
10 extensions, renewals, additions, deletions and changes as may be
11 reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes
12 thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with
13 such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the
14 Agreement by the Mayor or his designee; provided however, no
15 modifications to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations
16 or the liability of the City or decrease the duties and obligations
17 of Boeing and any such modification shall be technical only and shall
18 be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of
19 General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term
20 "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial
21 impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes that do not
22 substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City
23 under the provisions of the Agreement.

24 **Section 5. Oversight.** The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue
25 Department shall oversee the Agreement described herein.

26 **Section 6. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant**
27 **to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency.** One cycle emergency passage of this
28 legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that Boeing
29 intends to begin flight operations with Cat 6 planes in February
30 2023. JFRD will need to onboard the additional personnel authorized
31 herein to meet FAA requirements for ARFF levels of service before

1 these larger aircraft are allowed to land at Cecil Airport.

2 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
3 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
4 without the Mayor's signature.
