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## ORDINANCE 2022-906

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$391,472.29 PAID TO THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BY THE BOEING COMPANY FOR THE PROVISION OF ADDITIONAL AIRCRAFT RESCUE FIREFIGHTING (ARFF) SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT FOR AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS AT CECIL AIRPORT, INITIATED BY B.T. 23-030; AUTHORIZING POSITIONS, INITIATED BY R.C. 23-049; APPROVING AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE BOEING INDIRECT SUPPLY CHAIN FIXED PRICE CONTRACT FORM BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE BOEING COMPANY PROVIDING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR PROVISION OF ARFF SERVICES AT CECIL AIRPORT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, Section 1. within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$391,472.29 paid by The Boeing Company ("Boeing") to the City of Jacksonville for the provision of additional Aircraft Rescue Firefighting (ARFF) services provided by the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) for aircraft operations at Cecil Airport.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to receive revenue from The Boeing Company for the provision of additional ARFF services and support at Cecil Airport. JFRD has provided ARFF services to Boeing since the early 2000's. Boeing recently notified JFRD of its intent to provide Cat 6 aircraft operations at Cecil Airport and requested additional ARFF services to support these operations which will be necessary due to the size of aircraft that will frequently be flying into and out of the facility. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) will require greater levels of fire protection at Cecil Airport to accommodate these types of planes. The Boeing Indirect Supply Chain Fixed Price Contract Form (the "Agreement") authorized herein provides for JFRD to make available three additional ARFF-trained JFRD personnel per day to meet FAA requirements. JFRD currently has the necessary equipment to provide these additional services but will require authorization for nine additional full-time equivalent (FTE) positions to maintain this service level.

Section 3. Approval of Positions. There are hereby approved the positions more fully described in R.C. 23-049, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Approval and Authorization to Execute. There is Section 4. hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver for and on behalf of the City, the Boeing Indirect Supply Chain Fixed Price Contract Form (the "Agreement"), in substantially the same form placed On File with the Legislative Services Division and incorporated herein by this reference, between the City of Jacksonville and The Boeing Company providing the terms and conditions relative to the provision of ARFF services at Cecil Airport. The Agreement may include such extensions, renewals, additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor or his designee; provided however, modifications to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or the liability of the City or decrease the duties and obligations of Boeing and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

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Section 5. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department shall oversee the Agreement described herein.

Section 6. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that Boeing intends to begin flight operations with Cat 6 planes in February 2023. JFRD will need to onboard the additional personnel authorized herein to meet FAA requirements for ARFF levels of service before

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these larger aircraft are allowed to land at Cecil Airport.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
