Herlena is presently the President and Administrator for Christ Sanctuary Ministries, Inc. a nonprofit charity that serves in the areas of service, social, charity, religion, and education. The mission of the ministry is to organize, encourage, and educate by providing mentoring, military initiatives, financial and healthy living guidance, scholarships, food, and toy donation to the community. Christ Sanctuary Ministries annually provides Christmas toys to over 100 children in the Jacksonville area. The organization has its own Scholarship program and has awarded 9 \$500.00 dollar scholarships totaling \$4,500 to seniors in Duval County. The ministry supports Duval Academy a juvenile facility that houses up to 28 young men. Monthly the ministry provides, mentorship, birthday celebrations, celebrates all major holidays, and celebrates each young man upon graduating from the facility. The ministry celebrates all the young men that successfully graduate from high school and receives a High School Diploma or GED. Annually the ministries chair the Thanksgiving/Christmas Food Baskets giveaway and the Annual Easter Egg Hunt for the young men. She's an advocate on behalf of the Veterans, those who served, and those who are currently serving in the military. She has spearheaded many initiatives supporting and honoring Veteran Campaigns: In June and Oct 2021 she spearheaded the Military Benefits Seminar and Claims Seminar via Zoom for over 100 personnel all over the world educating them on what they don't know is hurting them, in the past she fed Veterans at the VA Clinic on Jefferson St., collected and donated 1,000 socks and toiletries to Elim Community Outreach, Inc., Trinity Rescue Mission, and City Rescue Mission, for the homeless Vets; participated in Women's Veterans Week, the Veterans Health Fair held at the VA Clinic in Jax, the Annual Veterans Day Parade, Wreaths across America by helping to place wreaths on the tombs of over 15,000 Vets, and provided Christmas for the Vets at the Clara White Mission.
