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WHEREAS, the Property Appraiser has certified to the Council the taxable value of real property within the City's taxing jurisdiction, which certification was provided by July 1, 2025; and WHEREAS, Section 200.065, *Florida Statutes*, requires that the Council advise the Property Appraiser of the "rolled-back rate", of

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. 2025 Rolled-back Rate Established. 4 Based upon 5 the certified taxable values provided by the Property Appraiser, the Council has computed and hereby establishes that the "rolled-back 6 7 rate" of millage under Section 200.065(1), Florida Statutes, is 10.86140 mills, or \$10.86140 per \$1,000 assessed taxable value, for 8 9 the General Services District, excepting Urban Services Districts 2 10 through 5 (the Beaches and the Town of Baldwin); is 7.5765 mills, or \$7.5765 per \$1,000 assessed taxable value, for the General Services 11 District, including only Urban Services Districts 2, 3, and 4 (the 12 Beaches); and is 8.7743 mills, or \$8.7743 per \$1,000 assessed taxable 13 value, for the General Services District, including only Urban 14 Services District 5 (the Town of Baldwin). 15

16 Section 2. Proposed 2025 Millage Rates. Based upon the 17 certified taxable values stated in Section 1, and upon consideration 18 of public spirited and competing community interests, the Council 19 proposes to levy millage rates for the 2025 tax year as follows:

## 29 General Services District, <u>including only</u> Urban Services District 5 30 (the Town of Baldwin):

31 9.5260 mills (operations), or \$9.5260 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable

1 value;

2 Section 3. Date, Time and Place for Public Hearing. The 3 Council will hold a public hearing to consider the proposed 2025 4 millage rates and the tentative Consolidated Government budget on 5 September 9, 2025, at 5:01 p.m. in the Council Chamber, 1st Floor, 6 City Hall, at 117 West Duval Street, Jacksonville, Florida.

7 Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage 8 upon 9 introduction of this Resolution is requested. The nature of the 10 emergency is to ensure the Council meets its obligation pursuant to Section 200.065(2)(b), Florida Statutes, to advise the Property 11 Appraiser of the "rolled-back rate", the proposed millage rates, and 12 the date of a public hearing on the proposed rates and tentative 13 budget within 35 days of certification by the Property Appraiser. 14

15 Section 5. Delivery to the Property Appraiser. The Chief 16 of the Legislative Services Division shall, upon approval of this 17 Resolution, forthwith deliver a fully executed copy of this Resolution 18 to the Duval County Property Appraiser.
