COUNCIL RULE 4.505 DISRUPTION OF MEETING

Any person who disrupts a regular meeting of the City Council, standing committees, special or select committees, sub-committees or any other public meeting presided over by a City Council Member may be forthwith barred, removed, or otherwise ejected, in the discretion of the presiding officer, from further attendance at that meeting. If necessary, due to the nature of the disruption, the audience may be cleared from the Council Chambers or meeting location in the discretion of the presiding officer.

Any person who refuses to leave the City Council Chamber may be subject to arrest.

Disruption of a meeting includes the following types of behaviors:

- 1) Any form of political campaigning or electioneering regarding a specific candidate or group of candidates in City elections;
- 2) Impeding the orderly progress of the meeting by shouting, yelling, whistling, chanting, singing, dancing, clapping, foot stomping, snapping fingers, cheering, jeering, using artificial noise makers or musical instruments, waving signs of any size, or engaging in any other display of excessive noise, sounds, or movement;
- 3) Displaying or waving signs of any sort, except where used to support the speaker's presentation at the podium, and only where the sign is 21 inches by 21 inches or smaller in size and cannot be displayed in a manner which unreasonably obstructs the view of the dais for any member of the audience, regardless of message;
- 4) Audible noise from cellphones or other electronic devices;
- 5) Consumption of alcohol or controlled substances;
- 6) Making vulgar or offensive remarks or gestures, or using threatening language or gestures, including but not limited to pantomiming discharging a firearm, choking, or throat-cutting;
- 7) Refusing to stop speaking when his or her time has expired or is otherwise directed by the presiding officer to do so due to disruptive behavior as described herein;
- 8) Returning to the meeting after having been removed or ejected, or attempting to do so.

• Presentation on Debt Affordability Study

Chris Cicero, Treasurer, and Roger Phillips, Senior Debt Manager, spoke about the Debt Affordability Study. Mr. Cicero said that the baseline report reflects the City's expected debt position at the end of FY25 plus estimated future debt remaining to be issued from previously authorized debt projects, and that all debt ratios are well within targets and minimums/maximums. He talked about the City's credit rating and how that is used. He talked about projected debt through FY 2030.

Council Member Lahnen spoke about passive income gained through General Fund interest. He mentioned Ordinance 2025-434, which was introduced at the June 10th council meeting and amends the City's Debt Management Policy to modernize and clarify existing provisions. Council Member Salem asked for a total of Reserve spending for the year. Mr. Peterson said he will provide that information.

Council Member Howland talked about the City's dollar debt per capita and how that compares with other cities, and he asked how much debt is attributed to the school board.

• Council Auditor Brian Parks to discuss:

- Report #891: Residential Waste Haulers Contract Audit

Mr. Parks reviewed the Residential Waste Haulers Contract Audit, to determine whether all payments from the City's Solid Waste Division to the residential waste haulers were properly supported, accurately calculated, correctly authorized, and timely paid. He mentioned several Auditor recommendations, including payment checklists to encourage accuracy, calculating the amount of liquidated damages each month and document the rationale for any deviations from charging the full amount allowed by the contract, monitoring fuel reimbursements, and coordinating with the Accounting Division. Council Member Salem asked when there will be follow-up on the recommendations. Mr. Parks said usually after 12-18 months to allow for recommended changes to full take effect.

- Report #892: City Accounts Payable Audit

Mr. Parks reviewed the City Accounts Payable Audit which focused on payments issued to suppliers, agencies, and individuals from August 1, 2023, through January 31, 2024, that were processed and approved via the Accounts Payable module in the financial system. He said there were some recommendations related to access controls, documentation and SOPs. There were no questions from the committee.

Mr. Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the NCSPHS amendment. Approved unanimously.

Council Member Salem offered Salem amendment #1 to expand the scope of the disclosure requirements in the bill to pertain to identified City employees to include appointed Directors of departments, Officers/Managers of Offices that act like departments, and all positions within the Office of the Mayor excluding Administrative Support personnel. Mr. Peterson explained the disclosure process. Council Member Pittman asked about the impact to non-profits and oversight. Carla Miller, Mayor's Office, said that the scope for the disclosures should be limited to be effective. Salem amendment #1 approved unanimously.

Council Member Salem offered Salem amendment #2 to exclude the requirement for the Procurement notices if the spouse or child is an unpaid board member. Salem amendment # 2 approved unanimously. All amendments rolled together as the Finance Amendment.

There was discussion about policy making and who controls that process. Council Member Freeman asked if the disclosures relate to all contracts with the City or just grants. Council Member Pittman encouraged cooperation with the Administration.

Council Member Arias cautioned about setting a precedent for other entities that may request advance payments instead of reimbursements.

- The City committed to a 5-year \$20 million capital project (\$4 million/year) as a match for capital improvements at the Jacksonville Zoo beginning in FY 24/25
- This \$12 million represents the final three years of the \$20 million commitment
- Instead of requiring the zoo to spend funding and be reimbursed by the City 50% of the cost up to the annual appropriation, this funding will be provided on a work performed and invoiced basis
- The Zoo will provide evidence of matching dollars spent against this \$12 million on a quarterly basis until the full match amount has been met

AUDITOR CONCERN:

With this advanced funding, the City is not assured the Zoo will contribute the required matching dollars as there is no penalty for not meeting the match
