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## ORDINANCE 2025-107

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$5,750,000.00 IN SOCIAL IMPACT PARTNERSHIPS TO PAY FOR RESULTS ACT ("SIPPRA") GRANT FUNDS FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY ("TREASURY DEPARTMENT"), TO ALLOW THE KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE ("KHA") TO IMPLEMENT A SUITE OF INVESTMENTS INTENDED TO PRODUCE SIGNIFICANT GOVERNMENTAL SAVINGS BY REDUCING NEWBORN EMERGENCY ROOM VISITS AND POSTPARTUM DEPRESSION (THE "PROGRAM"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 25-044; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; APPROVING A POSITION, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 25-077; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION TO SECTION 126.108(G), ORDINANCE CODE, WITH RESPECT TO SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY INSTITUTE FOR CHILD SUCCESS AND THE RILEY INSTITUTE; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY, AND/OR THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE, TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER CONTRACTS WITH INSTITUTE FOR CHILD SUCCESS AND THE RILEY INSTITUTE FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR THE PROGRAM; WAIVING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 77.111(A) (PROVIDER CONTRACTS), CHAPTER 77 (KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO EXEMPT THE SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY INSTITUTE FOR CHILD SUCCESS AND THE RILEY INSTITUTE FROM COMPETITIVE PROCUREMENT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

- (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$5,750,000 in Social Impact Partnerships to Pay for Results Act ("SIPPRA") grant funds from the United State Department of the Treasury ("Treasury Department") to allow the Kids Hope Alliance ("KHA") to launch a suite of investments, including a universal nurse home visit for new parents and a universal early literacy initiative through which health care providers coach parents on reading to their children (the "Program"). These investments will produce significant government savings value and through reductions in newborn emergency room visits and postpartum depression. The grant period begins on December 6, 2024 and ends December 31, 2029.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Program, and to procure the professional services of Institute for Child Success, as project manager for the Program, and the Riley Institute as the independent evaluator of the Program. This award is subject to the terms and conditions outlined in the United State Department of the Treasury

Notice of Award which has been placed **On File** with the Legislative Services Division and is incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Approval of Position. There is hereby approved the position more fully described in R.C. 25-077, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference. Said position is fully funded by SIPPRA grant dollars and will provide services in support of the Program.

Section 4. Invoking the Exemption in Section 126.108(g), Ordinance Code. KHA is hereby authorized to procure professional services from Institute for Child Success, as Project Manager of the Program, and with the Riley Institute as the Independent Evaluator in compliance with the grant described in Section 2 above. Pursuant to Section 126.108(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such services are exempted from competitive solicitation because the services to be provided are being approved via authorizing legislation pursuant to this Ordinance.

Section 5. Approval and Authorization to Execute. The Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary, and/or the Chief Executive Officer of KHA, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver a contract between KHA and Institute for Child Success, as Project Manager of the Program, and with the Riley Institute as the Independent Evaluator of the Program pursuant to which Institute for Child Success and the Riley Institute will provide professional services necessary for local implementation and administration of the Program in compliance with the grant described in Section 2.

Section 6. Waiver of the Requirements of Chapter 77 (Kids Hope Alliance), Section 77.111(a) (Provider Contracts), Ordinance Code. The City hereby waives the requirements of Chapter 77 (Kids Hope Alliance), Section 77.111(a) (Provider Contracts), Ordinance Code, with respect to the contracts with Institute for Child Success

and with the Riley Institute approved and authorized in Section 5 of this Ordinance. Section 77.111(a) requires contracts for children's services provided by third parties to be competitively procured by KHA via an evaluated bid process. This waiver is needed in order to allow KHA to directly contract with Institute for Child Health and the Riley Institute to provide the Program services described in the grant described in Section 2.

Section 7. Oversight Department. The Kids Hope Alliance shall oversee administration of the grant and the Program.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
