

Business Impact Estimate

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS), *ORDINANCE CODE*; ESTABLISHING AN HONORARY STREET DESIGNATION AND ASSOCIATED ROADWAY MARKERS FOR PASTOR ERNIE L. MURRAY, SR.; ESTABLISHING AN HONORARY STREET DESIGNATION ON MONCRIEF ROAD BETWEEN EDGEWOOD AVENUE WEST AND ROWE AVENUE IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 10 FOR PASTOR ERNIE L. MURRAY, SR.; PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TWO HONORARY ROADWAY MARKERS TO BE LOCATED IN APPROPRIATE LOCATIONS ON THE DESIGNATED ROAD IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 10; WAIVING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION 745.105(I)(2), *ORDINANCE CODE*, THAT THE HONOREE BE DECEASED FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS; WAIVING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION 745.105 (I)(3), *ORDINANCE CODE*, THAT THE HONOREE RESIDE IN THE COMMUNITY WITHIN FIVE MILES OF THE STREET BEING DESIGNATED FOR AT LEAST TEN YEARS; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD A COPY OF THIS ORDINANCE, ONCE ENACTED, TO THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, TRAFFIC ENGINEERING AND ADDRESSING DIVISIONS, FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION AND COORDINATION WITH THE APPLICANT AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The proposed ordinance seeks to install two honorary designation signs in memory of Pastor Ernie le. Murray, Sr., who served as the pastor of St. Thomas Missionary Baptist Church for more than 38 years. The ordinance meets the required 75% threshold from property owners' consent for the honorary markers.
