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ORDINANCE 2023-377

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$ 2,845,370.37 FROM 12 PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS AT OR NEAR COMPLETION TO "THE HODGES & GLEN KERNAN BOULEVARD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT" FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AND TRAFFIC SIGNAL IMPROVEMENTS ALONG HODGES BOULEVARD NEAR ITS INTERSECTION WITH J. TURNER BUTLER BOULEVARD; APPROVING AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE "GLEN KERNAN PARK COST SHARING AGREEMENT" BETWEEN THE CITY AND HODGES PROPERTIES I, LLC ("DEVELOPER") TO AUTHORIZE DEVELOPER TO DESIGN, CONSTRUCT, AND ENGINEER SUCH INTERSECTION AND TRAFFIC SIGNAL IMPROVEMENTS, WITH CITY TO REIMBURSE DEVELOPER FOR PORTIONS OF REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT DIVISION OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has experienced continued residential and commercial growth, and resulting vehicular traffic, in and around the area where Hodges Boulevard joins J. Turner Butler Boulevard (the "Hodges/JTB Junction"), and, in particular, at the intersection of Hodges Boulevard and Glen Kernan Parkway (the "Glen Kernan Intersection"); and

WHEREAS, Developer, along with Glen Kernan Park, LLC, a Florida

limited liability company ("GKP"), and Gate Petroleum Company, a Florida corporation ("Gate"), intend to develop a $50 \pm acre parcel$ at the western corner of the Hodges/JTB Junction into a full-service residential community, with retail and commercial uses (the "Development"); and

WHEREAS, the primary entrance into the Development shall be at the intersection of Hodges Boulevard and the existing median opening opposite Windsor Commons (the "Windsor Commons Intersection"), which currently lacks a traffic signal; and

WHEREAS, City has previously identified a need to construct a traffic signal at the Windsor Commons Intersection for traffic flow and safety purposes (the "Traffic Signal Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, build out of the Development will also add a new leg to the Windsor Commons Intersection and increase vehicular traffic in and around the Glen Kernan Intersection; and

WHEREAS, City has previously identified a need to construct certain intersection improvements at the Glen Kernan Intersection (the "Intersection Improvements") to accommodate existing traffic flow; and

WHEREAS, in connection with its pending build-out of the Development, Developer's engineers have already conducted various design and engineering analysis related to traffic signal and intersection improvements; and

WHEREAS, given the above, City has determined that the construction and inspection of the Traffic Signal Improvements and the Intersection Improvements (collectively, the "Improvements") can most efficiently and cost effectively be completed by the Developer in connection with the build out of the Development; and

WHEREAS, City has agreed to reimburse Developer fifty percent (50%) of the costs of the design, engineering, permitting, construction and inspection of the Traffic Signal Improvements based

on the Engineer's Opinion of Probable Cost prepared for the Improvements work ("EOPC"); and

WHEREAS, City has agreed to reimburse Developer one hundred percent (100%) of the costs of the design, engineering, permitting, construction and inspection of the Intersection Improvements based on the EOPC; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

- (c) Explanation of Appropriation: This legislation appropriates funds from existing projects that are at or near completion to the Hodges Boulevard and Glen Kernan Boulevard Improvements Project for Intersection and Signal Improvements along Hodges Boulevard at the median opening opposite Windsor Commons and at Glen Kernan Parkway. This transfer represents a reappropriation of funds and no additional debt is being incurred by City.
- Section 2. Purpose of Appropriation. The purpose of the appropriation is for funding the City's portion of the Improvements at the Intersection located on Hodges Boulevard.
- Section 3. Authority to execute the Glen Kernan Park Cost Sharing Agreement. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Glen Kernan Park Cost Sharing Agreement (the "Agreement") between the City and

the Developer, in substantially the same form as Exhibit 2, attached hereto. The Agreement may include such additions, deletions, and change as may be reasonable, necessary, and incidental for carrying out the purpose thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor or his designee. No modification of the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or the liability of City and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval of the General Counsel or his or her designee and all other appropriate action required by law. For the purposes of this Ordinance, "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City; including, but not limited to, changes in legal descriptions or surveys, resolution of title defects (if any), descriptions of infrastructure improvements and/or any road project, ingress and egress, easements and rights-of-way, performance schedules (provided that no performance schedule may be extended for more than one year without City Council approval), design standards, access and site plans, and other non-substantive changes that do no substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

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Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage upon introduction of this ordinance is requested to secure the City's funding commitment at the prices upon which the EOPC relies. The price of construction materials and services required to build the Improvements continues to escalate rapidly and the City should move expeditiously to lock in the price of the Improvements per the EOPC before further price escalation occurs.

Section 5. Oversight of Improvements. Oversight of the Improvements and the Agreement shall be provided by the Engineering

and Construction Management Division of the Public Works Department.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
