Ordinance 2019-652-E was approved on 10/22/19, appropriating \$250,000 from the Northwest Jacksonville Economic Development Fund (NWJEDF) to support the expansion of AA Auto Parts, Inc. The purpose of the funding was to provide a \$100,000 Business Infrastructure Grant and a \$150,000 Loan in connection with infrastructure improvements needed to accommodate the installation of an Italian manufactured Ing.Bonfiglioli Drake Model 8 metal shredder system on the company's property, located at 6641 West Beaver Street. The project is in compliance with the NWJEDF Guidelines.

The original Economic Development Agreement dated 11/22/19 provided for a completion date of 7/1/21 and provided for time extensions up to 1 year. The company experienced several delays, including environmental issues identified that needed to be addressed before the infrastructure work could begin; the Covid-19 outbreak began delaying construction, delivery of building materials, and finally the Italian installation team was delayed by the pandemic. Ordinance 2022-560-E extended the performance schedule by an additional 6 months, through 12/31/2022. Amendment Four extended the completion date by nine months from December 31, 2022, to September 30, 2023 and was approved by Ordinance 2023-78-E, enacted on March 14, 2023. Amendment Five, approved via Ordinance 2024-102-E, extended the performance schedule by twelve months, from 9/30/23 to 9/30/2024.

The installation crew arrived at the site in December 2023 and there has been a delay of a critical electrical component: the "transformer". The COVID pandemic resulted in a global disruption in the manufacture and delivery of electrical transformers, extending delivery dates from 50 to 100 weeks. JEA has indicated that the transformer needed to operate the proposed shredder system is on order but is not anticipated to be shipped to them until August 30, 2024, at the earliest. As a result, this Amendment Six is being requested to allow time to receive/install the transformer and ultimately complete the project. This would extend the completion date of the project to September 30, 2025.

The delays encountered in the installation of the shredder system have added considerable cost to the project. The initial cost was estimated to be \$5.15 million, however the delays encountered, and cost

increases incurred has the project cost to be \$7.02 million. Except for the arrival and installation of the transformer, all of the necessary building materials and other equipment is available on site. The shredder system won't be able to be completed until the installation crew from Italy arrives on site to complete the final installation and test the system. The installer has indicated they will not be able to schedule a site visit until the electrical transformer has been delivered to the project site.

This project will result in the expansion of an existing small minority owned business, creating at least 5 new full-time jobs, increasing the ad valorem tax base, and transforming a site located within a Level 1 Economically Distressed area from an auto junk yard into a modern metal shredding business.
