#### **Update by Department of Health on COVID-19**

Dr. Pauline Rolle, Interim Director Florida Department of Health in Duval County, said that they continue to see a decrease in positive cases in Duval County. The daily positivity rate as of yesterday is 2.6% and the target according to CDC guidelines is to have less than 5% positivity for 14 days. There have been 38 cases in the elementary schools as of September 10th. Dr. Rolle said that most of the spread is in the community and from individuals bringing it into the schools, not a spread within the schools.

CM Pittman asked how many tracers the City has to track the spread of COVID-19. Dr. Rolle did not have the exact number, but she said they have tracers from the CDC and the State and she feels the amount of tracing done has been sufficient.

CM Becton offered an amendment to exclude the kind of renaming which already have a process. Paige Johnston, Office of General Counsel, suggested removing streets from the renaming process or only halting when the renaming is after a person. CM Becton moved an amendment to remove streets from the process. CM Bowman said he couldn't support the bill which would tie the City Council's hands in the renaming process. The approved amendment would remove streets from the moratorium and change the length of the moratorium from 2 years to 3 months. Cherry Pollack, Office of General Counsel, said that this will help the 911 Committee which is meeting and had guestions about street renaming because this bill would have held that up.
