for particulate matter and ozone concentrations. The grant period commences on August 1, 2023 and ends on September 30, 2024. No City match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the purchase of new air monitoring equipment for particulate matter and ozone concentrations. This equipment will enhance monitoring of particulate matter pollutants in and near communities with environmental justice concerns as well as other communities by replacing existing filter-based monitors with continuous federal equivalent method monitors to provide 24/7 real-time reporting of air quality concentrations. A copy of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Grant Agreement/Notice of Award providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

Section 3. Oversight and Reporting. The Neighborhoods Department, Environmental Quality Division, shall oversee administration of the grant described herein and shall be responsible for submittal of the required reports in accordance with the grant agreement.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
