Council Member Diamond explained the bill. Council Member Freeman raised concerns about unintended consequences of the bill for children's services and UF Health, particularly regarding legal obligations and the potential conflict with city funding restrictions. Council Member Diamond responded by emphasizing the bill's intent was focused on enforcement and reporting, not penalizing medical providers or education-linked services. Council Member Freeman moved for an amendment to exempt UF Health, KHA (for one year), and labor and sex trafficking victims. Council Members Carlucci, Johnson, and Boylan expressed broader humanitarian concerns, including the risk of unintentionally denying support to vulnerable populations or future providers receiving city funds. Council Member Carrico supported the amendment and committed to restarting joint meetings with the school board to improve coordination around KHA eligibility. After further discussion, the Freeman floor amendment passed via a voice vote.

Council Members Johnson and Carlucci expressed concerns about the bill's potential unintended consequences and its impact on service providers. Council Member Freeman supported the bill and requested to be added as a co-sponsor, emphasizing the need to prioritize local children and families. Garrett Dennis clarified that the mayor has not declared Jacksonville a sanctuary city. Council Member Boylan moved for an amendment to add the word "knowingly" into the bill's language as it pertained to Cultural Services grants. The Boylan amendment passed via a voice vote. Council Member Miller cited JSO data to argue for the bill's relevance, while Council Member Johnson responded with additional context, noting the issue may be statistically limited. The bill as twice amended was moved and seconded.

After the initial vote, there was a motion/2nd to reconsider due to Council Member Johnson's electronic voting system failed to register his vote. It passed via voice vote. The Freeman amendment was passed via a voice vote. The Boylan amendment was passed via a voice vote. The bill as twice amended was moved and seconded.

Trista Carraher, Council Auditor's Office, explained the amendment. The amendment passed via a voice vote. Council Member Boylan explained the bill. Council Members Carlucci and Dr. Johnson opposed the restriction, highlighting the value of district representation in leadership. Council Member Carlucci moved for an amendment to include "eligible" before "at-large" into the bill's language. The Carlucci amendment passed via a voice vote.

Council Member Gay voiced concern that the bill could create a hierarchy among council members, stressing the equal representation of all 19 members and the shared responsibility of both district and at-large members. Council Member Freeman agreed and emphasized the value of at-large members, the role of relationship-building, and his own leadership journey, noting that outcomes are not predetermined. Council Members Boylan, Carlucci, and Johnson discussed reforming the leadership election process to improve transparency and timing. Council Member Freeman added further context about past leadership races and legislation changes. Council Member Boylan made a motion to withdraw the bill and it was seconded. Council Member Howland supported recognizing the contributions of at-large members but affirmed that all 19 members are qualified for leadership and deserve equal consideration.
