ORDINANCE 2024-477-E

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$125,000 FROM THE 7 8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESIGNATED CONTINGENCY TO 9 THE GENERAL FUND OPERATING SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO PRIVATE ORGS ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE 10 ADDITIONAL FUNDING TO DOWNTOWN VISION, 11 INC. ("DVI") FOR THE DOWNTOWN AMBASSADORS PROGRAM; 12 AMENDING ORDINANCE 2023-504-E, THE FISCAL YEAR 13 2023-2024 BUDGET, BY AMENDING SCHEDULE 14 AD (DOWNTOWN VISION BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 15 ESTIMATED REVENUES) AND SCHEDULE AE (DOWNTOWN 16 VISION BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT 17 DISTRICT 18 APPROPRIATIONS) TO REFLECT THE APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS AUTHORIZED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER 19 20 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE 21 DATE.

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WHEREAS, annually the City of Jacksonville ("City") executes an Enhanced Municipal Services Agreement (the "Enhanced Services Agreement") with Downtown Vision, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit organization ("DVI"), to provide community enhancement services Downtown ("Enhanced Services"); and

WHEREAS, the Enhanced Services Agreement is funded by special assessments collected within the downtown business neighborhood improvement district ("Downtown Improvement District") created pursuant to the City's home rule authority and Chapter 163, *Florida* 1 *Statutes;* and

2 WHEREAS, DVI's unique expertise in providing services within 3 the Downtown Improvement District under the Enhanced Services 4 Agreement enables DVI to provide certain services Downtown (as defined 5 in Chapter 55, Ordinance Code) more collaboratively and efficiently 6 for the City; and

7 WHEREAS, DVI employs Downtown Ambassadors to create and 8 maintain a clean, safe and hospitable environment by providing 9 Enhanced Services within the Downtown Improvement District seven days 10 per week including cleaning (e.g. litter and graffiti removal), safety and hospitality (e.g. providing directions, maps, event information), 11 12 social services (e.g. connecting homeless and transient individuals with local social service providers) and property maintenance (e.g. 13 repairing information kiosks and trash cans); and 14

WHEREAS, to offer its Ambassadors a competitive wage, the DVI has reduced the total number of Ambassadors that it employs from 26 to 22; and

WHEREAS, there has been an increase in Downtown events, including the monthly Sip & Stroll event along the Riverwalk and the nightly water shows at the revitalized Friendship Fountain and this increase in events necessitates an increase in the number of Ambassadors to ensure that Downtown is a safe, clean and hospitable place for all to enjoy; and

24 WHEREAS, the Council wishes to provide additional funding to 25 DVI to ensure that there are sufficient Ambassadors working to keep 26 Downtown safe and clean, to support the numerous special events that 27 occur Downtown, to promote the live/work/visit experience, and to 28 make Downtown more attractive to residents, businesses and visitors; 29 now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
 Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,

11 The funding above is an appropriation of \$125,000 from the 12 Council President's Designated Contingency to the General 13 Fund Operating Subsidies and Contributions to Private Org 14 account to provide funding to Downtown Vision, Inc. ("DVI") 15 for the Downtown Ambassadors Program.

16 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 17 Section 1 above is to provide additional funding to DVI to support 18 the Downtown Ambassadors Program, including hiring additional 19 Ambassadors to further the City's and DVI's common goals to keep 20 Downtown safe and clean and to make Downtown more attractive to 21 residents, businesses and visitors.

22 Amending Ordinance 2023-504-E, the Fiscal Year Section 3. 23 2023-2024 Budget, to Replace Schedules AD and AE to Reflect the Appropriation Authorized Herein. Ordinance 2023-504-E, the Fiscal 24 25 Year 2023-2024 Budget, is hereby amended to replace Schedule AD 26 (Downtown Vision Business Improvement District Estimated Revenues) 27 and Schedule AE (Downtown Vision Business Improvement District 2.8 Appropriations), to reflect the appropriation of funds authorized 29 herein to facilitate the addition of two new Ambassador positions for 30 the Downtown Ambassadors Program. The revised Schedule AD and revised 31 Schedule AE are attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein

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by this reference.

2 Section 4. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall 3 not lapse but shall carryover to September 30, 2025.

4 Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become
5 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
6 without the Mayor's signature.
