

BUSINESS IMPACT ESTIMATE

ORDINANCE 2024-254

AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS; APPROPRIATING \$80,000, INCLUDING \$50,000 TO RIVERSIDE-AVONDALE PRESERVATION, INC. ("RAP"), \$20,000 TO SPRINGFIELD PRESERVATION AND REVITALIZATION COUNCIL, INC. ("SPAR") AND \$10,000 TO MURRAY HILL PRESERVATION ASSOCIATION OF JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA, INC. ("MHPA"), FROM DESIGNATED CONTINGENCY ACCOUNTS WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND OPERATING - MISCELLANEOUS GRANTS AND AIDS ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR VARIOUS SERVICES AND INITIATIVES AS DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO DECEMBER 31, 2024; INVOKING THE EXEMPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR DIRECT CONTRACTS WITH RIVERSIDE-AVONDALE PRESERVATION, INC., SPRINGFIELD PRESERVATION AND REVITALIZATION COUNCIL, INC. AND MURRAY HILL PRESERVATION ASSOCIATION OF JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA, INC., FOR THE SERVICES AND INITIATIVES DESCRIBED HEREIN; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR DIRECT CONTRACTS WITH RAP, SPAR AND MHPA; WAIVING SECTION 118.602 (RESPONSIBILITY), PART 6 (CULTURAL SERVICE GRANT PROGRAM), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO AUTHORIZE AWARD OF THIS FUNDING TO SPAR AND RAP IN ADDITION TO CULTURAL SERVICE GRANT FUNDING THAT HAS BEEN OR MAY BE AWARDED BY THE CULTURAL COUNCIL; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY AND RAP, SPAR AND MHPA; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION OF THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
