ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 111.270 ΑN (HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES SPECIAL REVENUE FUND), PART 2 (HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES), (SPECIAL REVENUE AND CHAPTER 111 ACCOUNTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO AUTHORIZE EXPENDITURE OF UP TO TEN PERCENT (10%) OF FUNDS APPROPRIATED FROM THE HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO HOMELESS DIVERSION SERVICES PROVIDERS FOR ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS; APPROPRIATING \$200,000 FROM THE CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO THE SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS ACCOUNT WITHIN THE HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO PROVIDE FUNDING TO I.M. SULZBACHER CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, INC. SUBSECTION 118.301(A)(3)(II), PART (ADMINISTRATION OF CITY GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR USE OF CITY FUNDS FOR SECURITY AND UTILITY DEPOSITS; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND I.M. SULZBACHER CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, INC. FOR THE HOMELESS DIVERSION PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR REPORTING; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE GRANTS AND CONTRACTS COMPLIANCE DIVISION OF THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending Section 111.270 (Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund), Part 2 (Health and Human Services), Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust Accounts), Ordinance Code. Section 111.270 (Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund), Part 2 (Health and Human Services), Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust Accounts), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 111. SPECIAL REVENUE AND TRUST ACCOUNTS

PART 2. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

* * *

Sec. 111.270. - Homelessness <u>Diversion Initiatives</u> Special Revenue Fund.

There is hereby created a permanent Special Revenue Fund of the City to be known as the *Homelessness <u>Diversion Initiatives</u> Special Revenue Fund* (hereinafter the "Fund") into which shall be deposited

all payments, contributions, or donations of money, including gifts and grants, received for the purpose of assisting first-time homeless individuals or families to obtain temporary or permanent housing and other basic necessities (e.g. rent and/or utility assistance, security and other housing deposits, food, personal hygiene items, transportation vouchers, etc.). Funds shall be allocated to Duval County residents only who are at immediate risk of becoming homeless. Individuals/families qualified to receive this funding may receive a one-time payment of up to a maximum of \$1,500.00 per calendar year from this Fund. All sums placed into the Fund, which shall include any interest earned or accrued thereon, shall be appropriated by the Council prior to expenditure, and shall be utilized for funding consistent with the purposes of this Fund. These funds shall be appropriated at a minimum on an annual basis in conjunction with the annual budget in an amount not-to-exceed twenty percent (20%) of the available balance within the Fund as of September 30 of the immediately preceding fiscal year. Any entity receiving funds from the Fund for the provision of services to Duval County residents as outlined herein may use up to ten percent (10%) of the total funds disbursed to said entity for administrative costs to provide the services. The City Council may authorize an amount of less than ten percent (10%) for administrative costs in any appropriation. Monies deposited in the Fund shall not lapse but shall carry over to the next fiscal year. This Fund shall be overseen and administered by the Grants and Contract Compliance Division of the Finance Administration Department. An annual report of expenditures from this Fund shall be provided to the Council on or before November 30 each year.

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$200,000 from the Contingency account to the Subsidies and Contributions to Private Organizations account within the Homelessness Diversion Special Revenue Fund to provide funding to I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. ("Sulzbacher") for the Homeless Diversion Program (the "Program").

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 3. Section 2 is to provide funding from the City of Jacksonville to Sulzbacher for the provision of homeless diversion services to eligible residents of Duval County as outlined in Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev Term Sheet, December 4, 2023 -NCSPHS" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Sulzbacher will administer the Homeless Diversion Program through its Urban Rest Stop which will act as the single point of entry for clients of the Program. The Program will target individuals and families who are without permanent housing and who are seeking entry into the shelter system. The purpose of the Program is to keep those individuals and families who are at immediate risk of becoming homeless out of the "homeless system" by providing case management services and financial assistance for qualified expenses such as temporary hotel placement, vehicle repairs, moving assistance, childcare assistance, security deposits, and utility deposits at a maximum cost of up to \$1,500 per household. Sulzbacher also intends to hire

an experienced trainer to provide diversion training programs for interested community partners and agencies. Finally, Sulzbacher is committed to raising additional public and private funds for deposit in the City's Homelessness Diversion Special Revenue Fund for the provision of additional homeless diversion services in furtherance of the goals of the Special Revenue Fund.

Section 4. Invoking the Exemption in Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to directly procure the professional services of I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. for the provision of homeless diversion services. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Waiver of Section 118.107, Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract with I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. Sulzbacher is uniquely situated to provide the services described herein because the Urban Rest Stop, which will serve as the primary location for eligible clients to request and receive homeless diversion services, is an existing center that already serves as a location where individuals who are homeless or who are at risk of becoming homeless can receive a variety of services. Because this center is currently operational, this will allow Homeless Diversion Program services to immediately commence.

Section 6. Waiver of Subsection 118.301(a)(3)(ii),

Ordinance Code. Subsection 118.301(a)(3)(ii), Part 3 (Administration of City Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived to allow for use of a portion of the City funds for security and/or utility deposits for qualified households receiving assistance through the Program.

Section 7. Approval and Authorization to Execute. There is

hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City an agreement with I.M. Center for the Homeless, Inc. in an amount not-to-exceed \$200,000, subject to the Scope of Services and Budget more particularly described in Revised Exhibit 2, for a term commencing January 1, 2024 through September 30, 2024, and all other contracts and documents, including extensions, renewals and amendments to the agreement, and to otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code.

Section 8. Reporting. Sulzbacher shall provide quarterly reports regarding Program outcomes to the Neighborhoods, Community Services, Public Safety and Health Committee. Each report shall, at a minimum, provide the information outlined in Revised Exhibit 2.

Section 9. Oversight Department. The Grants and Contract Compliance Division of the Finance and Administration Department shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 10. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
