Bill Summary: This bill confirms the State Attorney of the Fourth Judicial Circuit's appointment of Octavius A. Holliday, Jr. to the Jacksonville Journey Forward Board, for an initial 3-year term expiring September 30, 2027.

Background Information: Ordinance 2024-635-E established the Jacksonville Journey Forward as a public body within the executive branch of the City to assess and make recommendations regarding community-based programs, services, activities, and contracts related to factors contributing to crime prevention, intervention, and rehabilitation as well as neighborhood safety and stability, and the prevention of juvenile and adult recidivism.

Section 85.105(a), *Ordinance Code*, outlines the composition of the Jacksonville Journey Forward Board which shall consist of eleven voting members, four of whom are appointed by the Mayor, three of whom shall be appointed by the Council President, with one appointment each from: the Sheriff of Duval County, the State Attorney of the Fourth Judicial Circuit, the Superintendent of Duval County Public Schools, and the Chief Judge for the Fourth Judicial Circuit.

To the extent feasible, the JJF Board should include individuals with experience in public health, education, workforce development, contracts and compliance, afterschool/camp operations, juvenile diversion programs, violence prevention or intervention, ex-offender re-entry programs, law enforcement and community engagement.

Mr. Holliday holds a bachelor's degree from Duke University and law degree from UF Levin College of Law. He works as the director of the human rights division for the State Attorney's Office. Mr. Holliday is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Inc. and 100 Black Men of Jacksonville.
