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RESOLUTION 2024-392

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE MONTH OF MAY AS ALS AWARENESS MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE AND URGING ALL CITIZENS TO PARTAKE IN THE MANY ACTIVITIES AND INFORMATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES THAT WILL BE OFFERED; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), commonly known as Lou Gehrig's Disease, attacks nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord, eventually robbing patients of their ability to control muscle movement, often resulting in fatality; and

WHEREAS, the initial symptom of ALS is a weakness of the skeletal muscles, especially of the extremities, which is followed by difficulty in swallowing, talking, and breathing, and thereafter muscle atrophy and functional quadriplegia; and

WHEREAS, ALS is a cruel disease that usually does not affect a patient's mental capacities, allowing the patient to remain alert and aware of her loss of motor functions; and

WHEREAS, every 90 minutes throughout the year someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone dies from the disease, and life expectancy from the time of diagnosis typically ranges from 2 to 5 years; and

WHEREAS, while great strides have been made in the scientific understanding of ALS over the past decade, the cause remains largely unknown and treatment options are limited; and research indicates that military veterans are at a 50% greater risk of developing ALS than those who have not served in the military; and

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WHEREAS, increasing related this awareness to neurodegenerative disease will benefit the Northeast Florida community and the national effort to find a cure for this terrible condition; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

The City Council hereby recognizes local, state Section 1. and national efforts to bring awareness to Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), commonly known as Lou Gehrig's Disease, recognizes May 2024 as ALS Awareness Month in Jacksonville. The Council urges all citizens to partake in the many activities and informational opportunities that will be offered during the month to raise awareness of the impacts of ALS in our community.

Section 2. Requesting Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 - Emergency. Emergency passage of this legislation upon introduction is requested in order for the resolution to be adopted as early as possible in the month being recognized.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
