PURPOSE: White Paper (Explain Why this legislation is necessary? Provide; Who, What, When, Where, How and the Impact.) Legislation appropriates funding received from Florida Housing Finance Corporation ("FHFC") for the State Housing Initiatives Partnership ("SHIP") program administered by the Housing and Community Development Division. Florida Housing Finance Corporation provides funds to local governments as an incentive to create partnerships that produce and preserve affordable homeownership and multifamily housing. The program was designed to serve very low, low and moderate income families. SHIP funds are distributed on an entitlement basis to all 67 counties and 52 Community Development Block Grant entitlement cities in Florida. This legislation includes an appropriation for program income.

SHIP dollars may be used to fund emergency repairs, new construction, rehabilitation, down payment and closing cost assistance, acquisition of property for affordable housing, matching dollars for federal housing grants and programs, homeownership counseling and foreclosure Intervention program.


