AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$1,000,000.00 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY, WITH NO CITY MATCH, TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023 REGIONAL CATASTROPHIC PREPAREDNESS GRANT PROGRAM ("RCPGP") TO FUND A COMPREHENSIVE RISK ANALYSIS TO ASSESS IMPACTS OF CLIMATE EXTREMES, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-021; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO ACCEPT, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE RCPGP AWARD DOCUMENTS BETWEEN THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ("CITY"); PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: Section 1. Appropriation. 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(C) **Explanation of Appropriation**

The funding above is a grant award from the U. S. Department of Homeland Security, with no local match, for the Fiscal Year 2023 Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program ("RCPGP") to fund a comprehensive risk analysis to assess the escalating impacts of climate extremes on critical infrastructure and identify mitigation solutions. Funding will provide education, tools, and training to increase the resilience of disadvantaged communities. The assistance arrangement for this program is on a Cost Reimbursement basis.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the RCPGP is to build 13 state and local capacity to manage catastrophic incidents by improving 14 and expanding collaboration for catastrophic incident preparedness. 15 The Fiscal Year 2023 RCPGP requires grant recipients to develop 16 17 innovative regional solutions to issues related to catastrophic incidents. The City submitted a proposal providing that the core 18 19 component of the City's project will be a multi-faceted, comprehensive 20 risk analysis study to evaluate the qualitative and quantitative 21 impacts of extreme temperatures on critical infrastructure and 22 promote mitigation solutions (the "Project"). The Project will, among 23 other things, identify failure points of hard infrastructure from 24 extreme temperature and all cascading impacts, assess information 25 flow between hospitals and the energy sector, examine the correlation between extreme heat and crime, including physiological effects and 26 27 scarcity of services such as law enforcement and public safety 28 impacts, civil unrest, mass migration, and identify and evaluate 29 potential mitigation efforts, such as undergrounding power lines for hard infrastructure and developing public outreach strategies to 30 support social infrastructure. In addition, the Project will map 31

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stakeholders across critical infrastructure sectors. The purpose of
 the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Project.
 The grant period is from October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2026.

Section 3. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to accept, for and on behalf of the City, the RCPGP Award Documents between the U. S. Department of Homeland Security and City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 4. Oversight. The City of Jacksonville
 Emergency Preparedness Division will provide oversight.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
