A RESOLUTION HONORING THE DUVAL COUNTY CHAPTER OF THE CHARMETTES, INCORPORATED, UPON OCCASION OF THEIR 55TH ANNIVERSARY, AND COMMENDING THEIR YEARS OF SERVICE THE JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY AND BEYOND; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Jacksonville, Florida, recognizes those organizations whose work has radiated light throughout our communities, and whose legacy is both deep-rooted and forward-reaching; and
