#### DEFER

There was a lengthy discussion regarding this bill, which would add a paid holiday for City employees to observe Juneteenth. Juneteenth marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed, two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and on June 17, 2021, it officially became a federal holiday.

Paige Johnston said that the additional holiday is subject to collective bargaining for unionized employees.

CMs Diamond and Cumber expressed concerns about the cost to the City for the added holiday, and asked the amount for one day of payroll. Diane Moser, Director of Employee Services, said that it is roughly \$1.8 million but that has to be paid whether employees are at work or not. She explained that the real cost would be in the form of a loss to productivity, and any needed overtime hours. Ms. Moser also said that this ordinance is written so as to apply to the approximately 1000 appointed City employees who are not in unions. CM Bowman suggested adding the Juneteenth holiday in exchange for an existing one, like the one personal day City employees may use annually. He asked how long that holiday has been included, and Ms. Moser said it was already in place when she started with the City 29 years ago. She also noted that to remove a holiday, the City would have to reopen contract negotiations with the unions and get them to agree to give up the personal day.

CMs Dennis and Priestly Jackson shared their strong support for the bill. The Chair opted for deferral to allow the bill sponsor, CM Gaffney, to be in attendance at the next meeting to speak on behalf of the bill.
