ORDINANCE 2023-794-E

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER TO BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE FLORIDA JUNIOR COLLEGE AT JACKSONVILLE, A BODY POLITIC (THE "GRANTEE"), A RELEASE OF RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF RELEASING THE CITY'S EXISTING RIGHT OF REVERTER IN AND TO A PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 940 N. MAIN STREET (R.E. NO. 074367-0000) (THE "PROPERTY"), THEREBY ENABLING THE GRANTEE TO SELL THE PROPERTY TO A THIRD PARTY BUYER IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Property is subject to a right of reverter created pursuant to Ordinance 1980-433-239 (the "1980 Ordinance") as set forth in that certain Special Warranty Deed recorded at Official Records Book 5128, Page 849 of the Public Records of Duval County, Florida (the "Deed"), a copy of which deed is attached hereto as Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 1980 Ordinance, the Property was declared surplus and conveyed for no consideration to Grantee, which then owned and utilized the contiguous parcel as a public junior college, with the condition, as memorialized in the Deed, that the Property would revert to the City if (i) Grantee no longer utilized the Property for educational and college related purposes, and (ii) Grantee failed to restore and maintain the exterior of an existing

building located on the Property within two years from the date of conveyance (collectively, the "Restrictive Covenants"); and

WHEREAS, after over 40 years of ownership, Grantee now desires
to sell the Property to a third party; and

WHEREAS, passage of this Ordinance by the Council will release the Restrictive Covenants and the City's right of reverter in the Property, thereby enabling Grantee to sell the property to a third party of its choice in its sole discretion, without regard to whether the Property is used for educational or college related purposes; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver to Grantee on behalf of the City, that certain Release of Restrictive Covenants in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit 2, and all such other documents necessary or appropriate to effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance for the purpose of releasing the Restrictive Covenants and the City's existing right of reverter in and to the Property and enabling the Grantee to sell the property to a third party buyer in its sole discretion.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
