Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Mayor's appointment of Pamela Conoly to the Jacksonville – Duval County Council on Elder Affairs, filling a seat formerly held by Ingrid Montgomery, for a partial term ending June 30, 2026.

Note: the term should be "first full term", not "partial term", since it is greater than 50% of a full term.

Background Information: The Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs is established pursuant to Chapter 82, *Ordinance Code*, and charged to serve as an advocate for the older persons in the city, to the governmental agencies responsible for the various plans and programs designed to help older persons; assist in the implementation of plans and programs selected by regional organizations, as they relate to the city and its citizens; designate priorities among programs developed in the city by public, nonprofit and private providers concerning older persons.

Section 82.101, *Ordinance Code*, provides that the Council on Elder Affairs shall be composed of 19 members, five of whom are at large members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.

Ms. Conoly had a career of more than 30 years in the insurance industry, with Progressive and as an independent claims adjuster. She was a liability claims manager for the City's Risk Management Division from 2012-2022. Ms. Conoly resides in Duval County in council district 2.
