AMEND/APPROVE

There was a lengthy discussion about this bill, which amends City Charter Article 4 – Division of Powers – and Article 21 - JEA – to provide that the JEA board of directors shall be comprised of 4 members appointed by the City Council President and 3 members appointed by the Mayor, all of whom shall be confirmed by the City Council. The bill authorizes a voter referendum to approve these Charter amendments to be held on November 3, 2020 in conjunction with the general election.

CM Dennis was in attendance to speak as the bill's sponsor and present two floor amendments, one that specifies how appointees might be removed if necessary (with a 2/3 majority vote in council) and one which clarifies JEA board term lengths. CM Newby expressed concerns about the residency requirement portion of the bill, which states that each appointee to the JEA board must be a resident and elector of the city for at least five consecutive years (rather than the current 6 consecutive months) prior to such member's appointment. CM Dennis agreed to strike that portion and leave the residency requirement of 6 months as is. CM Carlucci shared his concerns with making drastic changes to an appointment process which has existed since consolidation, due to just one problematic series of events. CM DeFoor and CM Priestly Jackson noted that the city has changed greatly over the last 50 years and as such some parts of the Charter should perhaps adapt as well. The floor amendments were approved unanimously and OGC will roll them into one Rules Committee amendment.

Jerry Holland, Property Appraiser, was in attendance to speak about this bill which will increase the amount of the homestead exemption for low income persons aged 65 and older from \$25,000 to \$50,000. State law permits localities to grant an exemption of up to \$50,000. The increase in the homestead exemption for low income persons aged 65 and older may impact 2,476 parcels of property, which would reduce the City's property tax collections in 2020 by \$553,219.65 based on the current in-progress 2020 tax roll and using the millage rate from 2019. The definition of low income varies each year and is determined by the federal government. In 2020, the "low income" definition for purposes of this exemption is a household income of \$30,721 or less. CM Diamond asked if Mr. Holland had consulted with leadership from the Beaches communities about the change. Mr. Holland has not yet, but the Beach communities will have the option to participate or not, as they see fit.
