5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING GRANT FUNDS IN THE
6 AMOUNT OF \$12,462,500.00 FROM THE UNITED
7 STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (USDOT)
8 GRANT FUNDING VIA THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF
9 TRANSPORTATION (FDOT) FOR ITS PARTICIPATION IN
10 THE PROJECT COSTS TO DEMOLISH A PORTION OF THE
11 ELEVATED, CONCRETE HART BRIDGE EXPRESSWAY AT
12 LIBERTY STREET BETWEEN GATOR BOWL BOULEVARD
13 AND A. PHILIP RANDOLPH BOULEVARD AND TO
14 CONSTRUCT AN AT-GRADE INTERSECTION AT GATOR
15 BOWL BOULEVARD, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 19-113;
16 AMENDING THE 2019-2023 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL
17 IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED BY ORDINANCE
18 2018-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT
19 ENTITLED "HART BRIDGE RAMP MODIFICATION";
20 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND
21 THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND
22 DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE
23 LOCAL AGENCY PROGRAM AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
24 FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE
25 CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR,
26 OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY
27 TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF
28 THE CITY, THE ROADWAY TRANSFER AGREEMENT
29 BETWEEN THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF
30 TRANSPORTATION AND THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE,

1 DUVAL COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR FURTHER
2 AUTHORIZATIONS TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND
3 ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, ANY AND ALL ADDITIONAL
4 DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO OBTAIN THE UNITED
5 STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (USDOT)
6 GRANT FUNDING VIA THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF
7 TRANSPORTATION (FDOT); PROVIDING FOR CITY
8 OVERSIGHT BY THE ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION
9 MANAGEMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
10 PUBLIC WORKS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

12 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

13 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2018-2019 fiscal year,
14 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the
15 indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to
16 the account(s) listed in subsection (b):
17 (B.T. 19-113 attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein
18 by this reference)

23 (c) Explanation of Appropriation

24 The funding above is a grant from the United States
25 Department of Transportation (USDOT) grant funding via
26 the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to the
27 other construction costs line item for its participation
28 in the project cost to demolish a portion of the
29 elevated, concrete Hart Bridge Expressway at Liberty
30 Street between Gator Bowl Boulevard and A. Philip
31 Randolph Boulevard and to construct an at-grade

1 intersection at Gator Bowl Boulevard.

2 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
3 Section 1 is to fund the demolition of a portion of the elevated,
4 concrete Hart Bridge Expressway at Liberty Street between Gator
5 Bowl Boulevard and A. Philip Randolph Boulevard and the
6 construction of an at-grade intersection at Gator Bowl Boulevard.
7 The intersection is to include signalization, pedestrian and bike
8 paths, installation of traffic calming improvements, and the
9 construction of a ramp at A. Philip Randolph Boulevard.

10 **Section 3. CIP Amendment.** Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the
11 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and
12 certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide
13 funding for the project entitled "Hart Bridge Ramp Modification."
14 The project is more fully described in the Project Information
15 Sheet, attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled as "Revised
16 Exhibit 2, Revised CIP, September 16, 2019 - NCSPHS" and
17 incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the
18 deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget
19 and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the
20 community because such deferral could jeopardize the City's ability
21 to be awarded the FDOT grant funds. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c),
22 *Ordinance Code*, enactment of this ordinance requires the
23 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at
24 the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section.
25 This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-
26 E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement
27 Program approved by Ordinance 2018-505-E shall continue in full
28 force and effect.

29 **Section 4. Authorization to execute Local Agency Program**
30 **Agreement.** The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary
31 are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of

1 the City, the Local Agency Program Agreement between the Florida
2 Department of Transportation and the City of Jacksonville, in
3 substantially the same form placed **Revised On File** with the Office
4 of Legislative Services.

5 **Section 5. Authorization to execute Roadway Transfer**
6 **Agreement.** The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary
7 are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of
8 the City, the Roadway Transfer Agreement between the State of
9 Florida Department of Transportation and the City of Jacksonville,
10 Duval County, Florida, in substantially the same form placed
11 **Revised On File** with the Office of Legislative Services. The
12 Roadway Transfer Agreement will allow the transfer by Map Transfer
13 of certain right-of-way to the City, after which the City will own,
14 operate, maintain, and repair the transferred right-of-way.

15 **Section 6. Further Authorizations.** The Mayor, or his
16 designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to
17 execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, any and all
18 additional documents necessary to obtain the United States
19 Department of Transportation (USDOT) grant funding via the Florida
20 Department of Transportation (FDOT) (described in Section 1 above),
21 including, but not limited to, federal and state agreements,
22 contracts, and other related ancillary federal and state grant
23 documents. Any such additional agreements executed by the Mayor
24 shall not obligate the City beyond the grant terms agreed to in
25 this ordinance.

26 **Section 7. Oversight.** The Engineering and Construction
27 Management Division of the Department of Public Works will provide
28 oversight.

29 **Section 8. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become
30 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
31 without the Mayor's signature.
