RESOLUTION 2026-67-A

A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S APPOINTMENT OF ASHLEY KENDRICK, A DUVAL COUNTY RESIDENT, AS AN ALTERNATE MEMBER OF THE FIVE POINTS DEPENDENT SPECIAL DISTRICT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CHARTER OF THE FIVE POINTS DEPENDENT SPECIAL DISTRICT, ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE 2025-539-E, FOR AN INITIAL TWO-YEAR TERM EXPIRING JUNE 30, 2028; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 189.02, *Florida Statutes*, provides that the City Council may create dependent special districts for the purpose of delivering essential services to specific areas within the City; and

WHEREAS on October 28, 2025, the City Council enacted Ordinance 2025-539-E creating the Five Points Dependent Special District (the "District") and establishing the Charter of the District, which was created to provide continuing services that include, but are not limited to, the provision of elevated levels of security, landscaping and promotion within the geographic boundaries of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District's Charter established the Board of Supervisors as the District's governing body, comprised of five Supervisors and three Alternates, each appointed to serve two-year terms; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6(b) of the District Charter, three Supervisors and two Alternates shall be appointed by the Council

President and confirmed by the City Council, and two Supervisors and one Alternate shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Confirmation of Appointment. The Council hereby confirms the Council President's appointment of Ashley Kendrick, a Duval County resident, as an Alternate member of the Five Points Dependent Special District Board of Supervisors in accordance with the Charter of the Five Points Dependent Special District, for an initial two-year term expiring June 30, 2028.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
