RESOLUTION 2025-113-A

A RESOLUTION DECLARING MARCH 9-15, 2025, MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS AWARENESS WEEK, URGING ALL CITIZENS TO PARTICIPATE IN ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS PROMOTING AWARENESS AND SUPPORT, AND COMMENDING THE NORTH FLORIDA CHAPTER OF THE MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS SOCIETY AND JAX BOURBON SOCIAL FOR THEIR EFFORTS TO ASSIST THOSE LIVING WITH MS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Multiple Sclerosis (MS) is a chronic, often disabling disease that affects the central nervous system, impacting more than 2.8 million people worldwide; and

MS symptoms vary widely and unpredictably, ranging from numbness and tingling to blindness and paralysis, emphasizing the need for continued research, education, and support for those affected by the disease; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville recognizes the importance of raising awareness about MS and encouraging efforts to improve the quality of life for individuals living with the condition; and

WHEREAS, the North Florida Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has made significant contributions toward providing resources, support, and advocacy for those affected by MS in our community; and

WHEREAS, Bourbon Social, a registered Jax 501(c)(3) organization founded in 2020, is dedicated to bringing bourbon enthusiasts together to raise funds and awareness for the National

Multiple Sclerosis Society through events such as Jacksonville's premier Bourbon & Whiskey Tasting. Since its founding, Jax Bourbon Social has raised more than \$325,000 for the National Multiple Sclerosis Society over four years, directly supporting MS programs, clinical fellowships, and mentorships; and

WHEREAS, the funds raised through Jax Bourbon Social have contributed to fellowship and mentorship programs that provide specialized care for those in the MS clinical workforce, allowing doctors specializing in neurology and MS treatment to focus on the latest advancements in MS care and treatment; and

WHEREAS, Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Week, observed March 9-15, 2025, provides an opportunity for individuals, organizations, and businesses to come together to participate in activities and events that foster greater understanding of the disease and inspire action toward finding a cure; and

WHEREAS, Walk MS: Jacksonville 2025 is scheduled for Saturday, April 5, 2025, at the Duval County Public Schools headquarters, 1701 Prudential Drive on the Downtown Southbank offering 1-mile and 3-mile accessible routes to unite the community in support of those affected by MS; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby declares March 9-15, 2025, as Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Week and urges all citizens to participate in the many activities and informational opportunities offered to promote awareness and support for those affected by Multiple Sclerosis. The City Council also commends the North Florida Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and Jax Bourbon Social for their dedication and efforts in advancing awareness, education, and advocacy for individuals and families impacted by MS.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
