AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$11,516 FROM THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE GENERAL FUND - GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT FUND BALANCE FOR THE MENTAL HEALTH OFFENDER PROGRAM ("MHOP"); APPROVING, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE FOURTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT COURTS OF FLORIDA TO PROVIDE FOR A MENTAL HEALTH INITIATIVE JAIL COORDINATOR; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH THE FOURTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT COURTS OF FLORIDA TO PROVIDE FOR A MENTAL HEALTH INITIATIVE JAIL COORDINATOR; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE OF GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

District Fund Balance to provide funding for a jail
diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders
to fund a Mental Health Initiative Jail Coordinator
("Coordinator"), to be housed in the court system, to
oversee the MHOP (\$11,516).

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for a Jail Coordinator position for the Mental Health Offender Program (MHOP), which is a jail diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders. The Mental Health Initiative Jail Coordinator will be managed by the court system.

Section 3. Agreement approved and execution authorized. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, the Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the Fourth Judicial Circuit Courts of Florida, in substantially the form as attached hereto as On File and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement") to provide for a Mental Health Initiative Coordinator. The Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modification to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an amount in excess of the

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amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of the Fourth Judicial Circuit Courts of Florida as stated in the Agreement, and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

Section 4. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of the Fourth Judicial Circuit Courts of Florida to provide for a Mental Health Initiative Jail Coordinator. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Oversight. The Mayor is requested to appoint the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance to oversee the project in Section 2 above and to ensure compliance with all other appropriate laws.

Section 6. Requesting one cycle emergency passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that mental health needs are great, and the community will be well served by not delaying these needed mental health services.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
