Staff Report on Proposed 2021B Series Text Amendment to add a Property Rights Element to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan

ORDINANCE 2021-334

Ordinance 2021-334 is an amendment to add a Property Rights Element (PRE) to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan. House Bill 59, signed by the Governor on June 29, 2021, requires that local government comprehensive plans include a property rights element by the earlier of the date of adoption of the next proposed plan amendment that is initiated after July 1, 2021, or the date of the next scheduled evaluation and appraisal of the comprehensive plan, which is November 1, 2023.

The general intent of the new element is to ensure that private property rights are considered in local decision making and that government respects judicially acknowledged and constitutionally protected private property rights.

The Planning and Development Department recommends **APPROVAL** of the text amendment in the attached **EXHIBIT 1** submitted as **Ordinance 2021-334**.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A NEW ELEMENT IN THE 2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, TO ADD A PROPERTY RIGHTS ELEMENT TO THE 2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, AS REQUIRED BY 163.3177(6), FLORIDA STATUTES, FOR TRANSMITTAL TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA'S VARIOUS AGENCIES FOR PROVIDING DISCLAIMER REVIEW; Α THAT THE AMENDMENT TRANSMITTED HEREIN SHALL TOM EXEMPTION FROM ANY CONSTRUED AS AN OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Development Department has initiated certain revisions and modifications to the text of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan in accordance with the procedures and requirements set forth in Chapter 650, Part 4, Ordinance Code, to add a new Property Rights Element to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, as required by Section 163.3177(6), Florida Statutes, and as set forth in Exhibit 1, attached hereto, dated May 11, 2021, and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Planning Commission, as the Local Planning Agency, held a public hearing on this proposed Amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, with due public notice having been provided, and reviewed and considered all comments received during the public hearing, and made a recommendation to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Land Use and Zoning (LUZ) Committee held a public hearing on this proposed Amendment pursuant to Chapter 650, Part 4,

Ordinance Code, and having considered all written and oral comments received during the public hearing, has made its recommendation to the Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on this proposed Amendment with public notice having been provided, pursuant to Section 163.3184(3), Florida Statutes, and Chapter 650, Part 4, Ordinance Code, and having considered all written and oral comments received during the public hearing, the recommendations of the Planning and Planning Commission and Development Department, the Committee, desires to transmit this proposed Amendment through the State's expedited state review process to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity, as the State Land Planning Agency, the Northeast Florida Regional Council, the Florida Department of Transportation, the St. Johns River Water Management District, the Florida Department Fish and Wildlife Environmental Protection, the Florida Conservation Commission, the Department of State's Bureau of Historic Preservation, the Florida Department of Education, and the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Affairs; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council for the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Approval of Amendment for Transmittal Purposes. The Council hereby approves the proposed Property Rights Element of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, as required by Section 163.3177(6), Florida Statutes, and as set forth in Exhibit 1, attached hereto, dated May 11, 2021, for transmittal to Florida's various required State Agencies for review.

Section 2. Disclaimer. The transmittal approved herein shall <u>not</u> be construed as an exemption from any other applicable local, state, or federal laws, regulations, requirements, permits or approvals. All other applicable local, state or federal permits or approvals shall be obtained before commencement of the development or use, and transmittal is based upon acknowledgement, representation

and confirmation made by the applicant(s), owner(s), developer(s) and/or any authorized agent(s) or designee(s) that the subject business, development and/or use will be operated in strict compliance with all laws. Transmittal does **not** approve, promote or condone any practice or act that is prohibited or restricted by any federal, state or local laws.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.

GOAL, OBJECTIVE AND POLICIES

GOAL 1

The City will recognize and respect judicially acknowledged and constitutionally protected private property rights in accordance with the Community Planning Act established in Chapter 163, Florida Statues.

Objective 1.1 Local decision making shall be implemented and applied with sensitivity for private property rights and shall not be unduly restrictive.

Policies 1.1.1

The City will ensure that private property rights are considered in local decision making.

1.1.2

The following rights shall be considered in local decision making:

- 1. The right of a property owner to physically possess and control his or her interests in the property, including easements, leases, or mineral rights.
- 2. The right of a property owner to use, maintain, develop, and improve his or her property for personal use or for the use of any other person, subject to state law and local ordinances.
- 3. The right of the property owner to privacy and to exclude others from the property to protect the owner's possessions and property.
- 4. The right of a property owner to dispose of his or her property through sale or gift.
