Chairman Salem convened the meeting and the attendees introduced themselves for the record. Chairman Salem announced that Joelle Dillard of OGC would be making a presentation on the Supplemental Community Benefits Agreement at the beginning of the meeting. Mr. Salem also distributed a list of several appropriation ordinances totaling \$2.3M that have been deferred pending discussion in the upcoming budget hearings. He said he had met with the Auditor's Office yesterday to prepare for the Thursday and Friday budget hearings. The budget handouts were sent out by the Council Auditor's Office via email to all council members.

Presentation by Joelle Dillard, Office of General Counsel, on the Supplemental Community Benefits Agreement

Joelle Dillard of the Office of General Counsel discussed the City's financial commitments in the Supplemental Community Benefits Agreement (CBA) that is the subject of pending Ordinance 2024-905. She noted that the Council had approved funding in the original CBA of \$56M for downtown riverfront parks; this ordinance allocates the remaining \$94M into 3 spending "buckets": 1) countywide strategic focus (\$50M over 4 years); 2) Eastside strategic focus (\$30M over 3 years); 3) City Council district CIP projects (\$14M in 1 year). There is also an Eastside Tax Increment Finance (TIF) proposal with 95% of incremental taxes over the base year staying in the Eastside area which is reflected in a map on the handout for the life of the stadium lease (30 years).

Chairman Salem asked if the council district funds are intended to be for a single capital improvement project in each district – Ms. Dillard said that's how the CBA was drafted. Council Member Lahnen asked about the timing for spending of the CBA funds previously approved. Ms. Dillard said the \$119M commitment from the Jaguars is spread out over the 30 years of the lease. Mr. Salem said he's asked the Auditors Office to update their future financial commitment spreadsheet to add the cost of buying into the Florida Retirement System to cover police officers and firefighters. Office of General Counsel attorney Mary Staffopoulos said the Jaguars' contribution to this supplemental CBA is payable at just over \$1M per year over the life of the lease. She said the previous CBA appropriation had to be done in general terms to account for potential council member conflicts. Council Auditor Kim Taylor said the original CBA's \$118M from the Jaguars is to be spent on uses determined by the team and the City administration, without further City Council approval. Ms. Dillard said the same procedure applies to this \$30M appropriation. Mr. Salem asked why Council not involved in approving the expenditures; Ms. Dillard said that's the way the CBA agreement is drafted. Council Member Howland asked how the Mayor could obligate the City for the expenditure of funds. Ms. Dillard said the CBA states Council approval is required before expenditure of city funds that the City is contractually committed to expending. City Council approval of the spending within the three "buckets" is still required. Kim Taylor clarified that the Jaguars' CBA funds never come to the City so are not subject to City appropriation. The City will get reports on how the funds are spent but can't control them.

Council Member Arias asked about the role of the CBA board(s) in deciding how the funds get spent. What do the boards control? Ms. Dillard said they will advise on the use of the \$31M appropriated by 2024-905 to the Supplemental CBA. Ms. Staffopoulos said the City could further explore how the Jaguars propose to spend their funds and negotiate terms. Chairman Salem said he met with the administration about the 2024-904 original CBA and he is fairly certain that City Council approval of the use of those funds was contemplated, so this is apparently a change from what he understood.

Chairman Salem asked if the City could approach the Jaguars about matching City General Fund appropriations for particular purposes. Ms. Dillard said that's beyond the scope of the CBA. Council Member Diamond asked if the Jaguars' \$119M could be accelerated or borrowed against; Ms. Dillard said it could not without the Jaguars' agreement. Mr. Diamond asked if the City is obligated to allocate anything more than the \$56M for parks from the original CBA. Ms. Dillard said that's what this Supplemental CBA is about – funding items beyond what was covered in the original CBA.

Fire Chief Keith Powers reported that the emergency operations center ran extremely smoothly during the Hurricane Debby mobilization this past weekend with all partners actively participating. He believes there's a good chance the City could meet the \$4.57M expenditure threshold that would allow the City to apply for 87% cost recovery from FEMA for its emergency expenditures. He noted that the Fire and Rescue Department's Urban Search and Rescue and swift water rescue units were deployed to Sarasota County to assist in their recovery from the effects of the hurricane. Council Member Arias asked who pays for City employees to deploy to Sarasota at the state's request. Chief Powers said the state pays that and it is not part of the local expenditure that count toward the FEMA \$4.57M reimbursement trigger. Several committee members thanked Chief Powers for the excellent response to the emergency. In response to a question Chief Powers said 224 people and some pets had used the emergency shelters over the weekend.

Chairman Salem reviewed the agenda items, announcing that 2024-436 and 2024-601 would be deferred for discussion at a later date.

Public Comment

John Nooney said the Environmental Protection Board is taking nominations for environmental award winners and he will be making several nominations. 2024-553 should be referred to the NCSPHS Committee and to the CPACs for their comments.

Phillip Peterson explained the amendment, which was approved unanimously via a voice vote. CFO Anna Brosche said this bill represents almost the last of the ARP funding that needs obligated by December 31, 2024 to be spent on one-time items, and this project addresses a substantial deferred maintenance need at the Performing Arts Center. There may be about \$1M or a bit less remaining to be obligated by the end of this year and the administration is still considering some project options. Council Member Lahnen noted that 2024-460 uses ARP funding so that needs to be recognized. Council Member Pittman asked if the Ritz Theater has received all of the funding it needs. Ms. Brosche said there is funding for the Ritz in next year's proposed CIP. The administration recognizes that there are many deferred maintenance needs at many public facilities. Council Member Howland said he is philosophically opposed to appropriating funds into general purpose buckets without having specific amounts for specific uses. Council Member Freeman asked about any progress on a naming rights agreement for the Performing Arts Center; Ms. Brosche said that would be a question for Alex Alston, the Sports and Entertainment Officer. Mr. Peterson said whether naming rights dollars go directly to the named facility or into the General Fund depends on the contractual terms of the agreement. The bill was tabled until later in the meeting pending someone from ASM Global could be present to discuss the actual cost of the roof work.

When the bill was taken up at the end of the meeting Ms. Brosche said she had been given a figure of \$6,972,795 for the roof replacement and associated waterproofing of the Performing Arts Center.

Council Member Howland moved an amendment to reduce the roof appropriation to \$6,972,795. Council Member Arias asked what will happen to the rest of the funds not being appropriated and whether ASM got multiple quotes on the roof project. Ms. Brosche said the remaining funds would go into the final ARP reconciliation process and be obligated by the end of the year as required. Council Auditor Kim Taylor said that pursuant to the Procurement Code, project funds have to be appropriated before an RFP or bidding process can take place. Bill Kenney with ASM arrived at the meeting and said the company received multiple quotes and will finalize the amount at a meeting with the chosen bidder later today. The amendment to reduce the PAC roof project to \$6,972,795 was approved unanimously via a voice vote and both amendments were rolled into a single Finance Committee amendment.

In response to a question from Council Member Freeman about the potential for a naming rights agreement for the PAC, Mr. Kenney said they are currently in discussion with two potential naming rights partners.

Chairman Salem announced that he would be abstaining from voting on this item due to a conflict of interest. Assistant Council Auditor Phillip Peterson explained the amendment, which was approved unanimously via a voice vote (Chairman Salem abstaining). Council Member Howland asked about the completion grant 15% threshold and whether that condition has been in previous agreements. Mr. Peterson said all projects have some level of minimum spending to qualify for the incentive, but not necessarily 85%. Council Member Lahnen asked about the verification process for minimum investment: Lori Boyer, CEO of the Downtown Investment Authority, said the DIA gets construction expenditure documents from the developer to verify developer spending. Council Member Pittman asked about JSEB participation efforts for this project; Ms. Boyer said there is standard language in all of the agreements regarding good faith efforts to utilize JSEBs and the developer has pledged to comply. DIA gets annual reporting on JSEB goal compliance. Cyndy Trimmer representing the developer said the development team will be meeting with the JSEB coordinator on August 20th to discuss efforts. Council Member Arias asked about developer funding for improvements to public rights-of-way and spaces; Mr. Peterson said they are required to invest \$620,000. Council Member Freeman asked to be included on any correspondence between the developer and Gregory Grant, the JSEB administrator. At Mr. Freeman's request Ms. Trimmer described the development team's project preparations and time frame for construction.

Council Member Howland said the cumulative impact of REV and completion grants and other incentive commitments is getting big and with difficult financial circumstances possibly impending the Council needs to look at true core government functions and be aware of its spending. He believes this project relates to infrastructure and therefore he supports it but cuts may be needed elsewhere to fund this type of project. Council Member Lahnen reviewed the City's financial commitments to this project and asked about the triggers for the completion grants. Brian Moll, CEO of Gateway Jax, said if the permits currently in process are approved timely then they will be ready to break ground in September. Mr. Lahnen said all completion grants should be conditioned on a project being open and operating. Council Member Diamond said he will support this project although he is philosophically opposed to completion grants for projects. Since the City has so much invested in downtown infrastructure it just makes sense to utilize it to the best advantage. At Council Member Pittman's request, Mr. Moll described his company's Water Street development in downtown Tampa and its catalytic impact on that downtown area.
