COUNCIL RULE 4.505 DISRUPTION OF MEETING

Any person who disrupts a regular meeting of the City Council, standing committees, special or select committees, sub-committees or any other public meeting presided over by a City Council Member may be forthwith barred, removed, or otherwise ejected, in the discretion of the presiding officer, from further attendance at that meeting. If necessary, due to the nature of the disruption, the audience may be cleared from the Council Chambers or meeting location in the discretion of the presiding officer.

Any person who refuses to leave the City Council Chamber may be subject to arrest.

Disruption of a meeting includes the following types of behaviors:

- 1) Any form of political campaigning or electioneering regarding a specific candidate or group of candidates in City elections;
- 2) Impeding the orderly progress of the meeting by shouting, yelling, whistling, chanting, singing, dancing, clapping, foot stomping, snapping fingers, cheering, jeering, using artificial noise makers or musical instruments, waving signs of any size, or engaging in any other display of excessive noise, sounds, or movement;
- 3) Displaying or waving signs of any sort, except where used to support the speaker's presentation at the podium, and only where the sign is 21 inches by 21 inches or smaller in size and cannot be displayed in a manner which unreasonably obstructs the view of the dais for any member of the audience, regardless of message;
- 4) Audible noise from cellphones or other electronic devices;
- 5) Consumption of alcohol or controlled substances;
- 6) Making vulgar or offensive remarks or gestures, or using threatening language or gestures, including but not limited to pantomiming discharging a firearm, choking, or throat-cutting;
- 7) Refusing to stop speaking when his or her time has expired or is otherwise directed by the presiding officer to do so due to disruptive behavior as described herein;
- 8) Returning to the meeting after having been removed or ejected, or attempting to do so.

There was a brief presentation from each of the entities for which there are appropriations in this bill. \$6,000,000 to the University of North Florida for capital repairs and upgrades to Hodges Stadium and construction of additional grass practice fields at the facility, will allow UNF to market the facility as a premier venue to host various regional and national conferences and sporting events, the City may use the stadium and its surrounding facilities for mutually agreed community events as scheduling permits with waived rental fees. Economic impact for the city through tourism/bed tax.

\$5,000,000 to Florida State College at Jacksonville for the purchase of a building at Cecil Commerce Center to house the FSCJ Training Institute for skilled construction and logistics trades or advanced manufacturing.

\$1 million to Northeast Florida Builders Association, Inc. for design, permitting and construction of the NEFBA Workforce Development Center, a centralized hub for classroom and lab instruction, outreach, and community engagement.

\$2,675,000 to Edward Waters University, Inc. for design, permitting and construction of a "Living, Learning, Community Center" residential facilities for EWU students and visitors to the campus and a venue and multi-purpose space for the University and the public.

\$325,000 to Workforce Industrial Training, LLC for the Operation Boost Initiative year-round, cost-free training for residents of Duval County who face barriers to employment, enables 100 students to earn nationally recognized certifications and credentials in various skilled trades including, but not limited to, construction site safety, carpentry, electrical, flooring, forklift operations and warehouse operations.

There was discussion about the possibility of using TDC funds for some of the funding for the UNF project. CM Howland expressed support for the portions of the bill related to workforce training. CM Lahnen shared concerns related to the deficit. CM Salem asked about clawbacks in the contracts, and said he would support funds going towards deficit reduction. CM Pittman asked about the amount specified for the WIT program and why it is less than the other projects. CM Peluso asked about the extension of the lease for the Schell Sweet Community Resource Center on the EWU campus.
