Jordan Elsbury of the Mayor's Office provided commentary on establishing a policy for surplus city vehicles. Mr. Elsbury stated that the Mayor's Office is currently working on a policy review for surplus vehicles and that there may be additional requests for surplus vehicles coming before a policy is in place, but said that the Council is the policy making body and can make a policy to surplus as many vehicles as wanted.

CM Dennis offered a floor amendment to postpone granting the vehicles to Nassau County until after the Duval County School Board referendum issue has been resolved.

CM Hazouri explained the purpose and background of the bill stating that the vehicles requested are specific police vehicles that were not wanted in Duval county and are going to be used in Nassau County by their School Board as police vehicle within their school system. After discussion with the committee, CM Hazouri requested to defer the bill until after the Duval County School Board

referendum issue is solved.

CM Freeman (Chair) ultimately decided to defer the bill.
