Jason Teal, OGC, explained the differences between the 2 substitutes.

There was discussion about the sufficiency of surety bonds for large projects, the replenishment of those funds if used, the notification process for a right-of-way project, and the requirement for a CEI inspector for some projects.

Carlo Fassi, TECO, and Jordan Elsbury, Ballard Partners, spoke on behalf of the industry substitute.

Mr. Peterson, Auditor's Office, talked about the required amount for the surety bonds.

Ms. Sickler, Public Works, spoke about the frequency of, and costs to repair, damage caused by the work in City rights-of way.

Council Member Miller talked about the improvements to Springfield through the efforts of the Springfield Cleanup Corps.

Michael Haskins, SPAR Executive Director, talked about the anti-blight initiative and the impact of the beautification projects in Springfield. He highlighted the multiplier effect of leveraging community resources, and the nimble nature of a small, local dedicated part-time and volunteer staff.

Council Member Miller talked about extra measures being used, like pressure washing and alley cleanups, in addition to trash removal. There was discussion about sustainable funding going forward. Council Member Salem cautioned about reliance upon City funding, and setting a precedent to support similar efforts in other neighborhoods.

Council Member Boylan asked to be added as a co-sponsor.

Ms. Staffopoulos explained the emergency. Approved unanimously.
