Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to provide funding for climate control reduction activities in Jacksonville. Specifically, the funded project will entail the establishment of a Greenhouse Gas Inventory and the creation and implementation of a climate action plan for the Jacksonville Metropolitan Statistical Area (the "Project"). Project activities will include development of greenhouse gas emission projections, reduction measures and targets, and various components of a climate action plan that would include elements for interagency intergovernmental coordination, public and stakeholder engagement, and a low-income/disadvantaged communities benefit analysis. The intent of the Project is to use the Greenhouse Gas Inventory to map out implementation measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Once the implementation measures are identified, this will provide the City an opportunity to compete for additional grant funding to pay for phase two of the grant.

This award is subject to the terms and conditions outlined in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Grant Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**. The grant period commenced on September 1, 2023 and will continue through August 31, 2027. A local match is not required for receipt of these grant funds.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2026-2027.

Section 4. Oversight. The Planning and Development Department shall have oversight of the grant and Project described herein.

Section 5. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that there

is a limited time to implement phase one of the grant in order to qualify for second phase funding.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
