RESOLUTION 2024-472

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE MONTHH OF JULY AS FRENCH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, French influence on American culture goes back hundreds of years to the landing of a French expeditionary force under the command of Jean Ribault at the mouth of what is now the St. Johns River in May of 1562 followed by the founding of the settlement of Fort Caroline, in what would become Jacksonville, Florida, under the leadership of Rene' Laudonnière in June of 1564; and

WHEREAS, the influence of France on American laws, political thought, art, culture, language, and social etiquette has been considerable throughout the centuries because of the close ties between the two nations, a connection forged when France was the greatest ally and partner of the American colonies in their fight for independence; and

WHEREAS, in the United States, July is designated as National French American Heritage Month and was established to honor the significant contributions made to the country by people of French descent. Currently, approximately 9.5 million Americans of French or French-Canadian descent live and work in the United States, with about 1.4 million of those speaking French at home and an additional 750,000 speaking a French-based creole language; and

WHEREAS, pockets of strong French influence still exist in several parts of the United States, including the state of Maine with the largest proportion of people identifying as having French ancestry and the state of Louisiana which boasts the largest French-speaking

population by percentage; and

WHEREAS, French food, culture, fashion, political thought and business enterprises have left an indelible mark on American culture and thought; now therefore
