AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$153,226.18, WHICH INCLUDES \$116,738.68 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY FUNDED THROUGH THE HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM, THROUGH THE STATE OF FLORIDA, DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ("FDEM"), AND A REQUIRED CITY MATCH OF \$36,487.50 FROM THE JXRS RESERVE - FEDERAL PROGRAMS - OTHER ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT, TO FUND THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 4651 NORTH KEN KNIGHT DRIVE, JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA 32209 (RE# 040259-0000) AND THE DEMOLITION OF THE RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE LOCATED THEREON, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 25-026; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY, TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE (THE "CITY"), THAT CERTAIN FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT NUMBER H1111 BETWEEN THE CITY AND FDEM; AMENDING THE 2025-2029 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2024-505-E TO PROVIDE PROJECT ENTITLED FUNDING FOR THE "HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT - 4651 KEN KNIGHT DRIVE NORTH (H1111)"; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THEJACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT,

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EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Appropriation. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, Section 1. within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program ("HMGP") award in the amount of \$116,738.68 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") through the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management ("FDEM"), and a required City match of \$36,487.50 from the JXRS Reserve - Federal Programs - Other Economic Environment Contingency account, for completion of the hazard mitigation project described in this Ordinance.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the acquisition of that certain property located at 4651 North Ken Knight Drive, Jacksonville, Florida 32209 (RE# 040259-0000) (the "Property"), and to fund the demolition of the private residential structure located thereon, including removal of foundation slabs and debris on the Property, as approved by FDEM and FEMA in accordance with the HMGP (the "Project"). Upon completion of the Project, the Property will be converted to green space and will

become subject to a perpetual open space conservation easement, in accordance with FEMA requirements. All activities associated with the Project shall be completed in strict compliance with federal, state, and local rules and regulations. The term of the grant, and period of performance, shall begin upon the City and FDEM's execution of that certain Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement Number H1111 (the "Grant Agreement") and shall end on August 31, 2027.

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Agreements. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Grant Agreement in substantially the same form as placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services, and any respective extensions or amendments thereto as necessary and appropriate to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2024-505-E, adopting the 2025-2029 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reflect this appropriation of funds to the project entitled "Hazard Mitigation Grant - 4651 Ken Knight Drive North (H1111)." This project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev CIP Sheet, January 6, 2025 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the unnecessarily delay such deferral will community because urgently-needed mitigation of this floodprone Property and the safe removal of residents from the immediate dangers of flooding. The Property is located in an area that is subject to persistent nuisance flooding and the Project will reduce future costs to the county,

state, and federal agencies that provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services in the area.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2024-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2024-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 5. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division, shall oversee Project, including administration of the Grant Agreement, as described herein.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
