AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$200,000 FROM A DESIGNATED CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO THE SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE FUNDING TO SPRINGFIELD PRESERVATION AND REVITALIZATION COUNCIL, INC. ("SPAR"), FOR THE SPRINGFIELD CLEANUP CORPS PROGRAM (THE "PROGRAM") DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER TO FISCAL 2024-2025; INVOKING THE EXEMPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH SPAR; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT CONTRACT SPAR; WAIVING SECTION (RESPONSIBILITY), PART 6 (CULTURAL SERVICE GRANT PROGRAM), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO AUTHORIZE AWARD OF THIS FUNDING TO SPAR IN ADDITION TO CULTURAL SERVICE GRANT FUNDING AWARDED BY THE CULTURAL COUNCIL; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND SPRINGFIELD PRESERVATION AND

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REVITALIZATION COUNCIL, INC. FOR THE PROGRAM;
PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE GRANTS AND
CONTRACTS COMPLIANCE DIVISION OF THE FINANCE AND
ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN
EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$200,000 from a Designated Contingency account to the Subsidies and Contributions to Private Organizations account to provide funding to Springfield Preservation and Revitalization Council, Inc. ("SPAR") for the Springfield Cleanup Corps Program (the "Program") which will consist of providing cleaning, litter removal and blight reduction services in the Springfield community.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding from the City of Jacksonville to SPAR for the Program as described in Exhibit 2, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The Program will entail providing cleaning, litter removal and blight reduction services in

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Springfield. The City funds will pay for both staff and supplies to administer the Program, including one full-time Operations Manager and three part-time Operations Associates. SPAR will track and report on the productivity and impacts of the Program with the intent that it will be continued and/or expanded in the future.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2024-2025.

Section 4. Invoking the Exemption in Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to directly procure Springfield professional services of Preservation Revitalization Council, Inc. to administer the Program described herein. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code. Such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Waiver of Section 118.107, Ordinance Code. provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow direct contract with Springfield Preservation Revitalization Council, Inc. This waiver is justified because SPAR has the long-standing connections with local residents and businesses in Springfield necessary to best understand their needs and the needs of the community. In addition, SPAR has conducted a pilot program in Springfield's commercial area in partnership with Downtown Vision, Inc. to provide similar services which received positive reception from the community.

Section 6. Waiver of Section 118.602, Ordinance Code.

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Section 118.602 (Responsibility), Part 6 (Cultural Service Grant Program), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived to allow SPAR to receive this funding in addition to Cultural Service Grant funding awarded by the Cultural Council.

Section 7. Approval and Authorization to Execute. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of agreement with Springfield Preservation an Revitalization Council, Inc. in an amount not-to-exceed \$200,000, subject to the Scope of Services and Budget more particularly described in Exhibit 2, for a term commencing on March 1, 2024 through February 28, 2025, and all other contracts and documents, including extensions, renewals and amendments to the agreement, and to otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code.

Section 8. Oversight Department. The Grants and Contract Compliance Division of the Finance and Administration Department shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 9. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
