8 AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; 9 PROVIDING FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMUNITY 10 DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM; APPROPRIATING \$7,492,238.48 FOR PROGRAM COSTS, 11 INCLUDING \$6,940,619.00 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT 12 13 OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT, \$499,408.34 FROM REPROGRAMMED GRANT FUNDS AND \$52,211.14 14 FROM PROGRAM INCOME, AS INITIATED BY REVISED 15 B.T. 26-001; PROVIDING FOR AWARD, AUTHORIZATION, 16 AND FUNDING, AND FOR THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE TO 17 18 EXECUTE FEDERAL PROGRAM CONTRACTS FOR CDBG PROGRAM FUNDS, AS APPLICABLE, TO IMPLEMENT 19 20 REVISED B.T. 26-001; PROVIDING AUTHORIZATION FOR 21 REALLOCATION OF GRANT FUNDS AS MORE PARTICULARLY 22 DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR FURTHER COUNCIL 23 ACTION IF REVENUE DIFFERS; PROVIDING FOR THE MAYOR AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND 24 25 DELIVER DOCUMENTS RELATING THE TO AWARD; APPROVING POSITIONS AND PART-TIME HOURS, AS 26 INITIATED BY R.C. 26-001; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE 27 28 DATE.

30 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban 31 Development (HUD) annually awards Community Development Block Grant

(CDBG) funds to local governments on a formula basis that the local 1 2 government may, in turn, award to qualified organizations to implement 3 the CDBG program; and

WHEREAS, the goals and objectives of the CDBG program are aimed 4 5 at developing viable urban communities by providing decent affordable housing and a suitable living environment and associated supportive 6 7 services to the most vulnerable in our communities, creating jobs through the expansion and retention of businesses, and expanding 8 9 economic opportunities, principally for low and moderate-income persons and families; and 10

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville is expected to receive 11 \$6,940,619.00 in CDBG funds from the United States Department of 12 Housing and Urban Development on or about October 1, 2025; and 13

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 34.203, Ordinance Code, 14 the 15 Jacksonville Housing and Community Development Commission (the "Commission") is designated as the agency responsible for making 16 17 recommendations to the Housing and Community Development Division on all CDBG grant funding awards made to qualified subrecipients for 18 19 community development and affordable housing initiatives and related 20 programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has completed its 2025-2026 Universal 21 22 Cycle application process and has recommended award of CDBG grant 23 funding to the various entities, projects and programs described in 24 Revised B.T. 26-001, attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 1**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev B.T. 26-001, June 16, 2025 - NCSPHS" and 25 26 the Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed use of CDBG 27 funding, attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled as "Revised 28 Exhibit 2, Rev Sched, June 16, 2025 - NCSPHS" both of which are 29 incorporated herein by this reference; now therefore

30 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: Section 1. Appropriation and Authorization. There is

hereby appropriated the sum of \$7,492,238.48 in CDBG program grant 1 2 \$6,940,619.00 from HUD, funds, including \$499,408.34 from reprogrammed grant funds, and \$52,211.14 from program income, for 3 distribution to various award subrecipients selected pursuant to the 4 5 Commission's 2025-2026 Universal Cycle for community development and affordable housing initiatives and related programs and services, and 6 7 to other City departments as appropriate for the remaining awards, and the City of Jacksonville is authorized to enter into federal 8 9 program contracts as appropriate and expend those funds in accordance 10 with the awards identified in Revised B.T. 26-001.

For the 2025-2026 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b) of Revised B.T. 26-001:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

20 The funding above is an appropriation of CDBG program 21 funding, including \$6,940,619.00 received from HUD, 22 \$499,408.34 from reprogrammed grant funds, and \$52,211.14 from program income, and will be spent on public services, 23 24 acquisition and rehabilitation of affordable housing, economic development, public facilities improvements, the 25 26 removal of slum and blight, and any costs associated with 27 administration or delivery of the CDBG program.

28 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation set 29 forth in Section 1 above is to expend the 2025-2026 available federal 30 CDBG program income received from HUD, to award federal contracts (as 31 appropriate) for the CDBG program, and to provide funding to various

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qualified organizations in the amounts set forth in Revised B.T.
26-001 and the Schedule of Proposed Funding. A copy of the grant
award letter from HUD is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4** and incorporated
herein by this reference.

5 Section 3. Authorization for Reallocation of Grant Funds. 6 In the event a sub-recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an 7 award of CDBG funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible 8 awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the 9 Commission for award of CDBG funds.

Section 4. Further Council Action. If HUD approves a different allocation of CDBG grant funds than is appropriated by this Ordinance, then the Mayor shall submit a supplementary budget to City Council for approval in accordance with the actual allocation received.

15 Section 5. Execution of Documents. The Mayor, or her 16 designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to 17 execute and deliver any and all documents necessary to effectuate the 18 purpose set forth in Section 2 above.

19 Section 6. Approval of Positions. There are hereby 20 approved the positions and part-time hours more fully described in 21 R.C. 26-001, attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by 22 this reference. Said positions are fully funded by CDBG grant dollars 23 and will provide services in support of the CDBG program.

24 Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 25 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 26 without the Mayor's signature.
