Bill Summary: This bill approves and authorizes the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary to execute a Sixth Amendment to the Amended and Restated Agreement for Residential Waste and Recycling Collection and Transportation Services (Service Area III) between the City of Jacksonville and Waste Pro of Florida, Inc. The amendment extends the agreement term through September 30, 2035; replaces the rate review process with annual CPI adjustments commencing October 1, 2025; establishes a process for extraordinary rate adjustment; sets fuel caps for FY 2025-2026, FY 2026-2027, and FY 2027-2028; amends the process for conducting residential premises counts; and makes other changes to provisions relating to collection services, vehicle identification requirements, liquidated damages, dispute resolution, and reporting requirements. Waives Section 382.308(l), Ordinance Code, regarding extension of contract. Provides for City oversight by the Solid Waste Division of the Office of Administrative Services.

Background Information: The purpose of this legislation is to extend and amend the City's current contract with Waste Pro of Florida, Inc. for residential waste and recycling collection services in Service Area III. The changes include moving from a rate review process to annual CPI adjustments, adding extraordinary rate adjustment procedures, setting multi-year fuel caps, revising residential premises count procedures, and amending several operational and administrative provisions. The waiver of Section 382.308(l), Ordinance Code, is required to allow the contract extension. The Solid Waste Division will continue to oversee the contract.

Policy Impact Area: Public works; solid waste and recycling services

Fiscal Impact: The amendment establishes annual CPI adjustments beginning in FY 2025-2026, sets fuel caps for FY 2025-2026 through FY 2027-2028, and may result in cost changes to the City based on CPI and extraordinary rate adjustments.
