WHEREAS, Jewish Americans are an integral part the Jacksonville community, with approximately 13,000 citizens; therefore

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby recognizes the immeasurable contributions of the Jewish American community to Jacksonville and the nation and joins in the celebration of the month of May 2025 as Jewish American Heritage Month in Jacksonville.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
