PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

Blue and White Charities, Inc., helps to sponsor three youth auxiliary clubs, each tailored to a specific age group. These clubs provide structured programming that promotes personal growth, leadership, and service.

Pearlettes (Ages 4–8)

- **Focus:** Early development of social skills, cultural awareness, and community involvement
- **Activities:** Age-appropriate workshops, arts and crafts, and service projects
- **Goal:** Build a foundation of confidence and kindness

Amicettes (Ages 9–13)

- **Focus:** Educational enrichment, teamwork, and character building
- **Activities:** Leadership training, STEAM-based projects, and cultural exploration
- **Goal:** Encourage academic excellence and civic responsibility

Archonettes (Ages 14–18)

- **Focus:** Leadership development, college readiness, and community service
- **Activities:** Mentorship, public speaking, volunteerism, and scholarship opportunities
- **Goal:** Prepare young women for future success and sorority life

The mission of the Program is to enhance youth members through mind, body, and spirit as they serve their community.

PROGRAM SCOPE OF WORK AND DELIVERABLES:

The Youth Auxiliaries Program is designed to cultivate leadership, academic excellence, and community engagement in girls ages 4–18 and includes:

- Youth workshops and conferences – including a trip to Disney which will provide more insight into STEAM
- College Prep and career workshops – workshops to cover topics such as college application process, financial aid, and resume writing
- Financial Planning/Budgeting skills
- Hosting holiday parties and game day for seniors

PROGRAM COSTS/PAYMENT TERMS:

Payments under this grant shall follow a pay-for-performance model. Recipient will submit invoices monthly based on a units-of-service/deliverable budget, with each activity invoiced at a fixed rate per session, per event, per item as applicable. Payments will be contingent upon submission of adequate documentation substantiating the delivery of services as required by the Kids Hope Alliance.

The City, including but not limited to the Council Auditor's Office, reserves the right to audit Recipient's financial records at any time during or after the Grant Term to ensure that funds are being spent appropriately and in accordance with this Term Sheet and the approved scope of work.

PROGRAM IMPACT & REPORTING:

- (i) Various workshops will be held to assist in increasing youth confidence, addressing conflict resolution and to expose participants to various career paths.
- (ii) Various measuring tools will be used that will include pre- and post- assessments, participant engagement, and surveys.
- (iii) A minimum of 25 youth will be served through the Program.

ADDITIONAL GRANT REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS:

Recipient's expenditure of City funds for the Program and the provision of services shall be subject to the terms and conditions of any contract entered into between the City and Recipient, as well as all applicable regulations deemed appropriate by the Kids Hope Alliance ("KHA"), including but not limited to, Chapters 77 and 126 of the *Jacksonville Ordinance Code*. Recipient shall use the City funds for the Program in accordance with the City Council-approved Term Sheet and Program budget. KHA may work with Recipient to amend this Term Sheet or the approved Program budget consistent with the Program's needs, provided that any substantial change to the scope or intent of the Program shall require City Council approval.
