## RESOLUTION 2024-262-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING CAPTAIN MIKE GETCHELL ON HIS WORK FOR JACKSONVILLE'S WATERWAYS AND PORT COMMUNITIES IN HIS MORE THAN FOUR DECADES OF SERVICE ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Captain Mike Getchell began his career in the waterways community in 1978; and

WHEREAS, Captain Getchell has long stood as a trusted coordinator and communicator in bringing various stakeholders together, including the United States Coast Guard, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration ("NOAA"), the United States Army Corps of Engineers, the United States Navy, and the City of Jacksonville, who all have an interest in Jacksonville's waterways to resolve waterway safety issues and navigational challenges; and

WHEREAS, through his efforts in conducting multiple risk assessments, at the request of the Army Corps of Engineers, Captain Getchell was able to develop a thorough list of mitigation efforts to increase navigational safety; and

WHEREAS, Captain Getchell has maintained a steady presence in the waterways community over the decades, consistently attending Jacksonville Waterways Commission ("JWC") meetings and serving as the maritime representative on the NOAA's Southeast Implementation Team; and

WHEREAS, through his service to JWC and NOAA, Captain Getchell has been a fierce advocate for marine wildlife, having been

Protection Program for JWC and in the Recovery Plan for the North
Atlantic Right Whale for NOAA; and
WHEREAS, each year, Captain Getchell has coordinated a meeting

instrumental in the development and implementation of the Manatee

WHEREAS, each year, Captain Getchell has coordinated a meeting of various waterways stakeholders in preparing for the upcoming hurricane season and established the protocol to assist the Captain of the Port to reopen waterways following any storm; and

WHEREAS, Captain Getchell worked to secure a \$2.8 million Port Security grant in 2012 for the installation of a Physical Oceanographic Real-Time System, which is a decision-support tool consisting of 27 strategically-placed sensors along the river that greatly improved the safety and efficiency of maritime commerce and coastal resource management; and

WHEREAS, Captain Getchell has decided to retire after more than four decades of service to the Jacksonville waterways community; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Waterways Commission honored Captain Getchell for his accomplishments ahead of his retirement at its meeting on March 14, 2024, and expressed interest in formally recognizing him via Resolution; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors Captain Mike Getchell and commends him for the tireless work that he has done to bring people together to keep Jacksonville's waterways open and safe. Recognizing that his commitment to improve navigational safety in the Port of Jacksonville will be sorely missed but not soon forgotten, the City Council expresses its gratitude for the work that Captain Getchell has done for Jacksonville's waterways over the past 46 years, its congratulations on his retirement, and its best wishes for his continued happiness long into retirement.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become

effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
