Chair man Salem convened the meeting, and the attendees introduced themselves for the record. The Chair reviewed the agenda items and announced that there would be several presentations prior to the start of the agenda: Springfield Preservation and Revitalization re: Ordinance 2025-99; Council Auditor Kim Taylor to discuss Report #769B, Follow-Up on State Housing Initiatives Partnership Audit; Report #865A, Follow-Up on Public Parking – Off-Street Parking Audit; Jaguar rent quarterly report. Items #14 – 2025-101 - and #19 – 2025-106 - will follow the presentations, then the rest of the agenda in order.

Public Comment

Denise Scott said she opposed proposed ordinance 2025-147 regarding enforcement action against illegal aliens because there is no need for the City to do what the state and federal governments are already doing. The federal government is cutting social and food programs and leaving people in need.

Council Auditor Kim Taylor presentations

Report #769B, Follow-Up on State Housing Initiatives Partnership Audit: Ms. Taylor noted that the original audit identified 14 issues, of which 11 were cleared at the time of the first follow-up. All remaining issues were resolved by this follow-up and the audit is closed out.

Report #865A, Follow-Up on Public Parking – Off-Street Parking Audit: the original audit identified 11 issues, all of which were resolved by this follow-up and the audit is closed out.

Jaguars quarterly rent report: Ms. Taylor indicated that she wanted to make a correction to a statement from the Quarterly Budget Summary report that she presented at the last Finance Committee meeting. She clarified that at the last meeting she indicated that for the first quarter, the Jacksonville Jaguars' stadium rent was not paid. However, this was anticipated to occur based on the wording in the Jaguar Stadium renovation agreement which provided that the City and the Jaguars were agreeing that they were not exchanging cash. Rather than having the Jaguars pay rent to the City and then the City pay the Jaguars for design costs, the City and the Jaguars agreed that the City would be provided a credit for stadium design costs based on the value of the rent. She noted the ASM Facility Fund still needs to be made whole by the Capital fund transferring dollars to it, but it may require legislation.

Chairman Salem said he hoped all the independent authorities would take action on their budget amendments during the fiscal year and not after the year-end close-out. At Council Member Freeman's request, Assistant Council Auditor Phillip Peterson said the JTA collected \$5.8M of revenue over budget for the year. Council Member Freeman asked Raj Srinath, JTA's CFO, to convey to JTA management his desire to see free transportation provided for low-income people traveling to apprenticeship training and jobs.

JTA is amending their FY 2023/24 budget by appropriating \$6,742,955 in additional grant revenues from within the Bus Division for the following:

- Bus: to cover overages in fringe benefits (\$1,561,733) and increased transfers to the Connexion Division (\$4,909,585) and Ferry Division (\$271,637).
- Connexion: the increased transfer from the Bus Division is to primarily cover overages for the contracted paratransit services.
- Ferry: the increased transfer from the Bus Division is to cover shortages in revenues due to the ferry being out of service for three weeks and overages in expenses primarily for insurance and other miscellaneous expenses.

Mr. Freeman asked about the relationship between Troon Golf and First Tee of Jacksonville at Brentwood. Dan Zimmer of Troon Golf said his company manages the course while First Tee provides programming. Robert Owenby of the Neighborhoods Department explained the use of the funds, primarily for the Neighborhood Matching Grant program with a portion going to administrative expenses for the foreclosure registry. In response to a question from Mr. Howland, Mr. Peterson explained how the funding for the 4 positions is provided by program revenue. Mr. Howland asked if surplus revenues are returned; Mr. Owenby said they are devoted to the various authorized programs. Mr. Peterson said that state law limits the use of the funds to only approved purposes and that's why they are segregated into a separate fund. Council Member Lahnen asked about the account balance; Mr. Peterson said it is about \$760,000, and this bill appropriates \$630,000.

Council Member Arias asked about how/when the employees get pay raises if they aren't funded from the General Fund; Mr. Owenby said they receive the same raises as other City employees receive. Mr. Peterson said about \$460,000 of the proposed appropriation goes to administrative costs, with the rest going to program costs. Council Member Arias asked for a presentation about the uses of the funds before the next appropriation is requested. Chairman Salem said he would defer the bill for one cycle to get a presentation at the next meeting about the fund and its uses. He said the Neighborhood Matching Grant program has been very successful and popular for a number of years. Council Member Pittman asked about funding equity and said the grants have been \$5,000 for a long time and both the individual grant amounts and total program funding may need to be increased. Phillip Peterson explained the request for the emergency which was approved unanimously via a voice vote. Council Member Diamond asked to be added as a co-sponsor. In response to a question from Council Member Howland, Brian Snow of the Sulzbacher Center said the use of JSO officers would replace some of the agency's private security. JSO will take over security for the Urban Rest Stop while the private security firm will continue handling the other Sulzbacher facilities. Mr. Howland said the Sulzbacher Center has made numerous mid-year budget enhancement requests every year for the past several years, which he finds very concerning from both Sulzbacher and other agencies that make such requests for additional funding. Council Member Arias agreed with Mr. Howland about the multitude of mid-year budget amendments of all kinds, which set a precedent for agencies to build the increases into their budget requests for next year. Council Member Freeman asked about the balance in the Special Council Contingency – Mr. Peterson said \$0 after all the pending ordinances proposing appropriations from this fund and those currently being drafted are introduced. Council Member Pittman said all non-profits are suffering from what is happening at the state and federal levels to cut funding. Council Member Lahnen asked if there are unused funds available in the Homeless Initiative; Mr. Peterson said about \$300,000. Chairman Salem said those funds were set aside for the Homelessness Initiative Special Committee to recommend uses. Mr. Arias said that's all that's left of the \$2M+ originally allocated to the committee for its work after Council appropriated funding for the PATH team and additional shelter beds. He recommended that anything related to homelessness funding should go through the special committee for review before council action. Chairman Salem said he did take it to the HIC at their last meeting.

Mr. Freeman asked Mr. Diamond for an update on the homelessness program at the Beaches. Mayor's Office Legislative Liaison Brittany Norris said the Beaches cities need to identify a contact person for the Homeward Bound program. Since there are 3 cities to deal with, perhaps a non-profit organization would step in to manage it. Chairman Salem asked Ms. Norris for a report at the next Finance meeting as was promised at the last committee meeting. He noted that there is a town hall meeting at the Beaches tomorrow night and there will likely be questions from citizens about the homeless program that deserve answers.
