PURPOSE: White Paper (Explain Why this legislation is necessary? Provide: Who, What, When, Where, How and the Impact.) Council Research will complete this form for Council introduced legislation and the Administration is responsible for all other legislation.

The subject legislation requests City Council approval of a Redevelopment Agreement following the Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program ("DPRP") guidelines for the rehabilitation and reuse of the historic Jones Brothers Furniture building located in the Northcore neighborhood of Downtown Jacksonville at 520 N Hogan Street (RE# 073857-0000). This project will result in the investment of approximately \$15.2 million for the acquisition and rehabilitation of the 38,000 square foot property and, upon completion, is anticipated to provide 29 units of multifamily housing and approximately 1,700 square feet of co-work space on the first floor. The legislation seeks a funding commitment in the amount of \$6,033,500 through the Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program (DPRP), subject to completion and inspection requirements. Funding under the DPRP also requires final approval and appropriation of funds by City Council as the project nears completion.

The DPRP as created by Ordinance 2020-0527-E for purpose of fostering the preservation and revitalization of unoccupied, underutilized, and/or deteriorating historic buildings.

Funding of the \$6,033,500 of forgivable and must pay loans will require future appropriation by the Jacksonville City Council and will be requested after the time to completion can be reasonably determined. Construction is expected to be completed by 1Q2026. The grants (forgivable loans) and the must-pay loan will be funded from the General Fund pursuant to the Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program and through the Downtown Economic Development Fund in an amount up to \$6,033,500 for the redevelopment of the building located at 520 N Hogan Street.

This project would not be feasible without support from the City through the DPRP, or alternative capital subsidy. The building requires significant rehabilitation to ensure ADA compliance and environmental abatement of hazardous materials to make it ready to be used once again and contribute to the City's tax base in its highest and best use.
