Construction is expected to be completed by 1Q2026. The grants (forgivable loans) and the must-pay loan will be funded from the General Fund pursuant to the Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program and through the Downtown Economic Development Fund in an amount up to \$6,033,500 for the redevelopment of the building located at 520 N Hogan Street.

This project would not be feasible without support from the City through the DPRP, or alternative capital subsidy. The building requires significant rehabilitation to ensure ADA compliance and environmental abatement of hazardous materials to make it ready to be used once again and contribute to the City's tax base in its highest and best use.
