Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment.

Council Member Johnson asked about item 5 in the amendment, "Clarify the report on City funding paid to JSEBs will be provided to City Council annually".

Mr. Peterson reviewed the purpose for that item, which is to clarify to whom, when and how often the reporting should occur.

Council President Salem suggested reporting to the Finance Committee.

Bill Delaney, Mayor's Office, suggested the reporting occur in the 4th quarter.

Council Member Boylan made a motion to amend item 5 in the amendment to require JSEB funding reporting to City Council when sitting as the CRA Board, annually in the 3rd quarter.

Motion hand vote failed 2-5 with Council Members Boylan and Amaro in the affirmative.

Council Vice President White made a motion for a floor amendment to amend item 5 in the amendment to require JSEB funding reporting to the Finance Committee in the 4th quarter (November/December). Council Member Freeman asked about receiving the data prior to the budget process, and about a rubric or expectations for the report.

Gregory Grant, JSEB Administrator, said he will forward this year's data to the council members. Anna Brosche, CFO, said JSEB reporting usually occurs at the end of the fiscal year and is posted on the JSEB webpage. Council Member Johnson asked about the timing of the reporting, the rubric, and dissemination of the data to council directly instead of just on the webpage.

Council Vice President White made a motion to amend his amendment to include a snapshot report at 6 months. Approved unanimously.

Council Member Johnson talked about including the rubric to the amendment. It was decided that the rubric will be discussed by the JSEB Special Committee at their next meeting, in collaboration with Mr. Grant and Mr. Peterson.

Hand vote on the White amendment as amended (to amend item 5 in the amendment to require JSEB funding reporting to the Finance Committee in the 4th quarter (November/December), with a snapshot report at 6 months). Approved unanimously.

Hand vote on the full Auditor's amendment with the changes approved for item 5 made through the amended White amendment. Approved unanimously.

Council President Salem expressed support for the portions of the bill about establishing the Office of Central Services and creating a Technology Services Department. He spoke about the new sports foundation to market the city for sport events, in connection with the TDC and Visit Jacksonville. Council President Salem made a motion for a floor amendment about moving Sports and Entertainment to be a division under OED, instead of being under Parks or elevating it to its own department. Council Member Johnson asked about the reasoning for the move.

Kelli O'Leary, Mayor's Office, talked about streamlining approvals and efficiencies.

Alex Alston, Sports and Entertainment, spoke about being in a position to negotiate deals with authority.

Ms. O'Leary explained the salary increases and offsets through this bill.

Ed Randolph, OED, talked about the functions and capacity of his office. He explained the relationship between OED and JaxUSA as a marketing arm for recruiting businesses to Jacksonville.

There was discussion about the significance of Sports and Entertainment to the city's economy, the right place and structure for Sports and Entertainment within the City Administration, and the proposed salary increase for Mr. Alston.

Council Vice President White suggested that Mr. Alston report directly to the Mayor for 6 months and then be reassessed before deciding if Sports and Entertainment should be its own department. Council Member Boylan talked about the approval role of council, and supporting the autonomy of the Administration to organize at they wish.

Council Member Amaro said the shift Sports and Entertainment to be under OED is lateral move, and that Sports and Entertainment should be a department in order to have a more transformational impact.

Council Member J. Carlucci shared his support for Council Vice President White's suggestion. Mary Staffopoulos, OGC, explained the Administration's hierarchy and establishment of departments

in the Ordinance Code.

Council Member Johnson talked about the importance of entertainment events apart from sports.

Council Member Johnson talked about the importance of entertainment events apart from sports, and the impact on quality of life.

Council Member Freeman spoke in support of Mr. Alston's qualifications and work ethic.

There was a discussion of compromising to establish Sports and Entertainment as an Office, led by a single officer with no chiefs. Consensus to withdraw the Salem floor amendment.

Council President Salem motion for floor amendment to establish Sports and Entertainment as an Office, led by a single chief officer. Approved unanimously by hand vote.

Council Vice President White made a motion to move the White floor amendment. Mary Staffopoulos, OGC, explained White amendment about the Central Services Department to be instead called the Office of Administrative Services to avoid confusion with the title, and retaining police and fire pension or civil service benefits for individuals appointed by the Administration. Approved unanimously by voice vote. All of the amendments were approved to be rolled together as the Rules substitute.

AUDITOR COMMENTS/CONCERNS

- 1. There are no specifically stated penalties in the Redevelopment Agreement, besides general default, to address a failure by DCFA to meet the development improvements, performance schedule, or expected capital investment, with the exception of a minimum required expenditure on Direct Costs to receive the Completion Grant.
- 2. The City could have invested millions of dollars into the facility and DCFA could abandon the project during construction. The City's only recourse is to sue for specific performance.
- 3. The City is required to receive approval from the United States Secretary of the Interior for any leases on the subject property. The City has spent \$5.7 million on improvements related to the Fair relocation but has not yet received final approval of the lease with DCFA.

AUDITOR RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS

- 1. We recommend that DCFA be required to provide an irrevocable letter of credit in an amount acceptable to the City for the demolition of the DCFA Improvements in the event the DCFA Improvements are not completed.
- 2. We recommend that the City not spend additional dollars until final approval of the lease has been received from the United States Secretary of the Interior.
- Ordinance 2023-209-E originally approved a Redevelopment Agreement and Ground Lease with the Duval County Fair Association (DCFA) to:
- Develop 82.37 acres of City-owned land located adjacent to the Equestrian Center to serve as the new site of the Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair and DCFA corporate offices
- Provide for construction of improvements by both DCFA (estimated at that time to be \$15 million) and the City (estimated at \$27.2 million and already appropriated in the CIP)
- Complete construction by June 1, 2025
- Authorize a Ground Lease with DCFA for a term of 40 years with three 10-year extension options for \$100/year with an option to lease an additional 60 acres adjacent to the DCFA Parcel

- Bill 2024-285 will approve an Amended and Restated Redevelopment Agreement with the DCFA to:
- Authorize a \$1.5 million Completion Grant to be paid upon substantial completion of the DCFA Improvements. Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendments.

Council Member Freeman spoke about JSEB history, innovation, and required reporting on program metrics.

Ed Randolph, OED, indicated that the OED was agreeable to the amendments proposed by Mr. Peterson.

Mr. Peterson said that additional specificity was needed on several items to prevent possible legal challenges in the future, including: 1) the need for a definition of what constitutes a "high impact television show", 2) the need for more clarity on the application of the county residency requirement; and 3) more clarity on participant net worth and tier information. The ordinance was deferred to a future meeting.
