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Ordinance authorizing amendments to Chapter 118, Part 8 as follows: (1) 118.807(a) to change the date on which PSG Council Members must submit their scores of PSG applications, (2) 118.807(d) to change the date on which the PSG Council adopts its tentative rankings (which also starts the appeals period required by Code), and (3) 118.808(b) to change the date on which the PSG Council adopts the final funding allocations of public service grants.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare):

This legislation would amend Chapter 118, Part 8, which includes the provisions governing the application, scoring, awards, and appeals of the City's Public Service Grants. The intention of these changes is to streamline the process and to shave unnecessary days that are obstacles to timely execution of public service grant contracts, which also delays the timing of reimbursement funding to the nonprofit organizations delivering the services. These changes would take effect with the FY25 grant awards that will be made in October 2024. The public purpose of this ordinance would be to accelerate the delivery of services for the "most vulnerable populations" by providing executed contracts and opening the path for reimbursement payments.

2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the City of Jacksonville, if any: (a) An estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur; (b) Any new charge or fee imposed by the proposed ordinance or for which businesses will be financially responsible; and (c) An estimate of the City of Jacksonville's regulatory costs, including estimated revenues from any new charges or fees to cover such costs.

There is no change to compliance costs for nonprofits. There are no new charges or fees imposed. There is no change in COJ's regulatory costs. This ordinance would facilitate faster service delivery and assist nonprofits in not carrying the costs of delivering services for which they do not yet have a contract due to the delays in processing.
