RESOLUTION 2024-122

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING MARCH AS NATIONAL RED CROSS MONTH AND COMMEMORATING THE 143^{RD} ANNIVERSARY OF THE AMERICAN RED CROSS AND THE 110^{TH} ANNIVERSARY OF THE NORTHEAST FLORIDA CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN RED CROSS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the American Red Cross is a humanitarian organization founded in 1881 and originally chartered by Congress as a federal instrumentality in 1900, but receives no federal funding; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the American Red Cross is to prevent and alleviate human suffering in the face of emergencies by mobilizing the power of volunteers and the generosity of donors; and

WHEREAS, the American Red Cross responds to more than 65,000 disasters annually, and delivers vital services to members of the Armed Forces, their families, and veterans at home and overseas, and provided lifesaving health and safety training to more than 5 million people in 2023; and

WHEREAS, March is recognized as Red Cross Month across the nation and 2024 marks the 143rd anniversary of the American Red Cross and the 110th anniversary of Florida's first chartered Red Cross Chapter, established here in Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, the American Red Cross has repeatedly answered the call to assist those in need in Northeast Florida, beginning with the Yellow Fever epidemic of 1888, including support in Jacksonville to American troops during the Spanish American War, then later providing relief to those affected by Jacksonville's Great Fire of 1901; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Florida Chapter of the American Red Cross provides its humanitarian services across thirteen counties in Northeast Florida and is the headquarters for the 35-county Red Cross North Florida Region stretching from the First Coast across the entire breadth of the Florida Panhandle; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Florida Chapter of the American Red Cross in 2023 helped nearly 2,000 family members affected by nearly 700 home fires or other disasters, hosted 59 blood drives throughout the Region, including collections targeted at Sickle Cell Disease and vital minority blood-type collections, and regionally provided more than 13,000 vital services to military members, veterans, and families, and deployed more than 200 of its 1,000 volunteers in response to hurricanes and other disasters; and

WHEREAS, American Red Cross disaster assistance is free, and 90 cents of every dollar donated goes directly to mission service delivery; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby recognizes March as National Red Cross Month, the 143rd anniversary of the American Red Cross, and the 110th anniversary of the Northeast Florida Chapter of the American Red Cross, and commends the volunteers and paid staff of the North Florida Region for their continuing humanitarian service to our City and to the State of Florida.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
