RESOLUTION 2025-442-A

A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE INSTALLATION OF SIGNAGE BY THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION DESIGNATING THE ENTRANCE TO THE HISTORIC DURKEEVILLE NEIGHBORHOOD; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO TRANSMIT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION, ONCE ADOPTED, TO THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, named after former Union soldier Joseph H. Durkee, the Historic Durkeeville Neighborhood was established in the early 20th century as a predominantly African American neighborhood, providing refuge and opportunities for Black families during segregation; and

WHEREAS, Durkeeville served as a cultural and economic hub for African Americans, where businesses, churches, and schools flourished, creating a self-sustaining community that was instrumental in the Civil Rights movement of the 20th century; and

WHEREAS, the Historic Durkeeville Neighborhood contains the J.P. Small Memorial Stadium, formerly Durkee Field, home of the Negro League and minor league baseball teams, where figures like Hank Aaron, Leroy "Satchel" Paige, Roy Campanella, James "Cool Papa" Bell, and William "Judy" Johnson played the game on their way to baseball's Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, the Historic Durkeeville Neighborhood also contains

Durkee Gardens Historic District, which is listed in the National

Park Service's National Register of Historic Places; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby encourages the Florida Department of Transportation to install a marker on the off-ramp for Exit 353D on Interstate 95, designating the entrance to the Historic Durkeeville Neighborhood, and any other additional signage on the borders of the Historic District.

Section 2. Directive to the Chief of Legislative Services

Division. The City Council hereby directs the Chief of the Legislative

Services Division to forward a copy of this Resolution, once adopted,

to the Florida Department of Transportation.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
